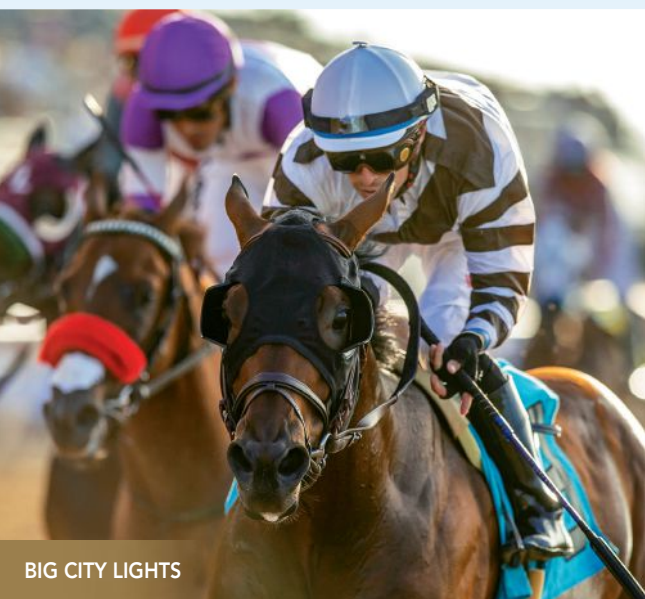

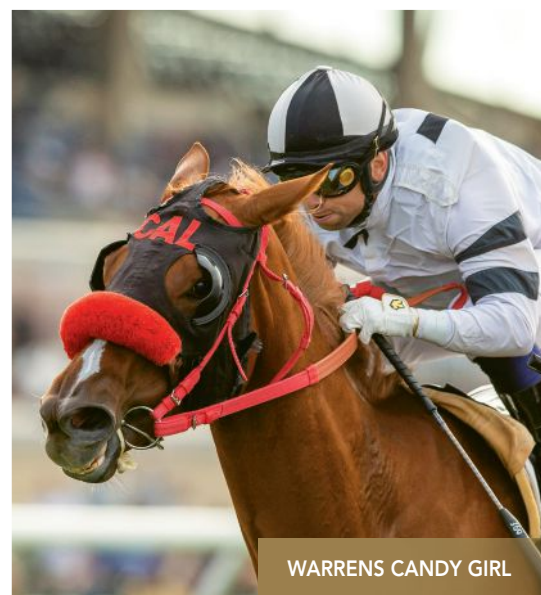

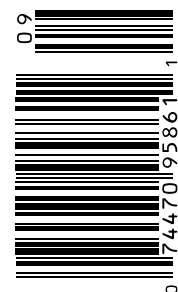

Vote Yes on Proposition 26

The Coalition for Safe, Responsible Gaming led by California Indian tribes is heading the effort to authorize highly regulated in-person sports wagering at tribal casinos and four licensed racetracks if passed in November. Prop 26 will also authorize tribes to offer craps and roulette at their casinos. By authorizing strictly in-person wagers at tribal casinos and racetracks, racing will benefit.

The proposition includes all the safeguards Californians have enjoyed for many years that ensure responsible sports wagering and prevent underage and problem gaming. The measure is supported by California horse racing and a broad coalition of more than 50 California Indian tribes.

Proposition 27 will also appear on the Nov. 8 ballot and is largely funded by DraftKings and FanDuel.

It would legalize online betting for corporations that license with a recognized California tribe. Currently, three tribes in California support 27.

Proposition 26 allows tribes and four racetracks to offer brick-and-mortar wagering only. It protects California jobs and horse racing's exclusivity for Internet wagering. The 10% tax on racing wagers will support public schools, wildfire prevention, public safety, mental health programs, and other state priorities.

Prop. 26 will increase foot traffic to California's premier racetracks and expose new bettors to the excitement and beauty of horse racing. Sports wagering attracts young, educated individuals who value experiences provided by betting on a favorite team and, in the future, a favorite horse or trainer. By requiring in-person betting only, racing is

ideally suited in the state's population centers to capitalize from the huge increase in bettors coming to the track and introducing new generations to horse racing.

Proposition 26 has broad support from business, public safety, labor, social justice and faith-based organizations, political organizations, and more. In her statement of support for Prop. 26, longtime labor and civil rights leader Dolores Huerta said, "Tribal gaming has given California's Indian tribes the resources to fight through generational poverty, oppression, and disenfranchisement. The in-person Tribal Sports Wagering Act will empower tribes to create new economic opportunities for their members and all Californians through safe, responsible sports wagering."

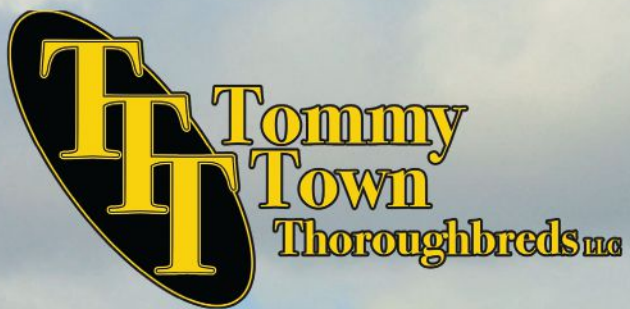

CAL-BRED DAYS SET FOR 2023

Mark your calendars for Jan. 7 and May 28, 2023. Several stakes in the Golden State Series for California-breds and California-sired runners will be conducted on those two dates at Santa Anita. The Arcadia track released its stakes schedule of 93 stakes for the 2022-23 winter-spring meeting, with those two dates an important component.

Each date will offer five Golden State Series stakes. Cal-breds can run for \$900,000 in stakes purses Jan. 7 and another \$600,000 May 28.

The Jan. 7 schedule: \$200,000 California Cup Derby for 3-year-olds at 1 $\frac{1}{16}$ miles; \$200,000 Leigh Ann Howard California Cup Oaks for 3-year-old fillies at one mile on turf; \$150,000 Don Valpredo California Cup Sprint for 4-year-olds & up at six furlongs; \$200,000 Unusual Heat Turf Classic for 4-year-olds & up at 1 $\frac{1}{8}$ miles on turf; \$150,000 Sunshine Millions Turf Sprint for fillies and mares 4-year-olds & up at 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ furlongs on turf.

The May 28 schedule: \$150,000 Snow Chief Stakes for 3-year-olds at 1 $\frac{1}{8}$ miles on turf; \$150,000 Melair Stakes for 3-year-old fillies at 1 $\frac{1}{16}$ miles; \$100,000 Thor's Echo Stakes for 3-year-olds & up at six furlongs; \$100,000 Crystal Water Stakes for 3-year-olds & up at one mile on turf; \$100,000 Fran's Valentine Stakes for fillies and mares 3-year-olds & up at one mile on turf.

The Santa Anita stakes schedule includes 10 grade 1 stakes, highlighted by the \$750,000 Runhappy Santa Anita Derby April 8, and 58 total graded stakes. The meet will open on its traditional Dec. 26 and run through June 18.

McAnally Receives Pincay Award

Hall of Fame trainer Ron McAnally has been named the 18th recipient of the Laffit Pincay, Jr. Award. The Pincay Award is named for and presented by the Hall of Fame rider, and it goes to those who have served the sport with integrity, extraordinary dedication, determination, and distinction.

McAnally, 90, began his career 64 years ago and continues today. He started working as a hot-walker for his uncle, trainer Reggie Cornell, in 1948 and saddled his first winner in 1958. McAnally has gone on to win more than 2,500 races and earn more than \$126 million in purses. Horses he has trained include Hall of Famer and two-time Horse of the Year John Henry, Hall of Famer and champion Bayakoa, Hall of Famer and champion Paseana, California-bred multiple stakes winner

Donut King, millionaires Olympio and Super Moment, and 2003 Pacific Classic (G1) winner Candy Ride.

"He's one of the great trainers of all time," said fellow Hall of Fame conditioner Richard Mandella. "And he's shown that with his ability to do well with every different kind of horse. He's a person I've watched and learned from throughout my career. He's just a terrific horseman."

Pincay, who retired in 2003 from a riding career that saw him win a then-world record 9,530 races, rode for McAnally many times.

"Ron put me on horses right from the beginning," Pincay said. "He rode me on a lot of his horses, and there were many good ones. Whenever I rode a horse for him, I rode with a lot of confidence. I knew I was going to be on a good one."

CARMATHON RAISES OVER \$300,000

CARMA, a nonprofit dedicated to the aftercare of California racehorses, exceeded expectations with its third CARMathon, raising more than \$300,000. TVG helped promote the summer fundraiser, which brought in more than double what was generated in 2021.

Throughout Aug. 20, CARMA shared the spotlight with the Del Mar Oaks (G1T). TVG's on-air commentators promoted the event, and the network showed videos showcasing Thoroughbreds who had retired through CARMA's placement program in their second careers as sport horses. CARMathon received publicity through many social media platforms as well.

The fundraiser was on pace to meet its goal of \$150,000 when an anonymous donor put forth a dollar-for-dollar matching fund up to \$150,000. This was met by the end of the day, bringing the total to more than \$300,000.

"Today has been about the horses, about the racing industry coming together, about supporting our equine athletes, and about all the non-profit organizations dedicated to Thoroughbred aftercare," said Billy Koch, CARMA's president and Little Red Feather Racing founder and managing partner. "I know I speak for the entire CARMA board of directors when I say we are overwhelmed by the generosity and support the racing industry has shown today. Aftercare is not an afterthought—and that was proven today."

THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

10 YEARS AGO

HALO DOLLY, a California-bred 4-year-old filly who would go on to become a millionaire, captured her first graded race Sept. 3, 2012, in the \$250,000 Yellow Ribbon Handicap at Del Mar. With Joe Talamo aboard, she bid three deep in the stretch and got up to defeat favored City to City by 1¼ lengths. Halo Dolly, trained by Jerry Hol-

lendorfer, completed 1¼ miles on the turf in 1:40.52. Rod and Lorraine Rodriguez bred Halo Dolly, a daughter of Popular—Spanish Halo, by Comic Strip, and sold her privately as a yearling to trainer Greg James. At the time of the Yellow Ribbon, Hollendorfer owned her in partnership with several others, having purchased her privately after she broke her maiden. "You could tell she was very intelligent," said Lorraine Rodriguez. "She was pretty easy to do anything with."

25 YEARS AGO

AVENUE OF GOLD, bred in California by John and Betty Mabree and raced by their Golden Eagle Farm, captured the \$100,000 Mae De Vol Sprint Handicap at Bay Meadows Sept. 8, 1997. Ridden by Ron Warren Jr. and favored at 8-5, she prompted the pace of Beaming Year and went on to defeat fellow California-bred Batroyale by three lengths, with Beaming Year third. Avenue of Gold stopped the timer in 1:08.88 for six furlongs. Jerry Hollendorfer trained the 4-year-old daughter of Avenue of Flags—Golden Garden, by Golden Eagle II, for the Mabrees. Avenue of Gold won five stakes that year, all in Northern California. She added two more in 1998, including another edition of the De Vol, and ultimately earned a total of \$519,500.

50 YEARS AGO

HILL CIRCUS, bred in California by George Pope Jr. and raced in the name of his El Peco Ranch, beat the boys to win a division of the Del Mar Handicap Sept. 9, 1972. Sent away the 9-5 favorite under jockey Fernando Toro, Hill Circus went to the lead on the backstretch in the 1¾-mile turf event and scored by 4½ lengths in 2:16 over fellow Cal-bred War Heim, with Wing Out third. Hill Circus was a 4-year-old daughter of Hillary—Mary Machree, by Moonlight Run. Pope had bred and raced Hillary and stood him at El Peco, and the stallion's stakes winners include Hill Rise. Mary Machree's wins include the Vanity Handicap. Hill Circus earned a total of \$161,689.

COHEN TO TOC BOARD

Owner/breeder Tim Cohen was unanimously appointed to the Thoroughbred Owners of California board of directors. He replaces Mike Harrington, who with his wife, Patty, retired from training earlier this year and who resigned from the TOC board. Per the TOC bylaws, Cohen will be required to run in the 2023 board election.

Cohen owns Rancho Temescal in Piru and races many horses with his family, which includes Red Baron's Barn, founded by his father, Jed. Red Baron's Barn and Rancho Temescal were leading owners at the 2021-22 winter-spring Santa Anita meeting. The Cohens have bred such good California-breds as Camino Del Paraíso, Edwards Going Left, and Bally's Charm, the latter winner of the 2022 Snow Chief Stakes presented by City National Bank.

AAEP Works to Recruit More Equine Vets

The American Association of Equine Practitioners has formed a commission on equine veterinary sustainability to develop strategies to retain and recruit more veterinarians to equine practice. Many areas of the U.S. face a shortage of equine practitioners, and the commission will focus on five key areas: compensation, strategies for effective emergency coverage, veterinary practice culture, internships, and supporting the growth and development of the equine veterinary student.

According to AAEP data, only about 1.3% of new veterinary graduates enter equine practice directly each year, and another 4.5% pursue further training in equine internship positions. Within five years, however, 50% of these veterinarians leave for small-animal practice or quit veterinary medicine altogether. The primary reasons are burnout due to the personal demands of the profession and personal struggle due to the lower starting salaries for equine practice when compared to companion-animal practice.

The commission will also ensure that the needs of one- and two-doctor practices are carefully considered. Approximately 50% of AAEP members operate practices of this size. Outreach to horse owners and equine-industry partners will create expanded awareness and yield additional perspective.

Gates Patton Named Farrier Director of the California Horse Center

Ada Gates Patton, president of the California Thoroughbred Foundation, has been named farrier director of the California Horse Center Flag Is Up Farms in Solvang. She will oversee all horseshoeing on the farm and has been involved with the California Horse Center in educational work about good farrier practices.

The first female farrier licensed to shoe Thoroughbred racehorses in the U.S. and Canada, Gates Patton has served as farrier liaison for the 1984 Olympic Games and the FEI World Games in Lexington, Ky., and as the official horseshoe inspector for the Pasadena Tournament of Roses Parade.

Flag Is Up is home to Monty Roberts, whose join-up methods of starting horses are world famous. He and his wife, Pat, have been involved

in the California breeding and racing industry for decades. Gates Patton started shoeing for Roberts in 1978 at the CTBA Sales' Hollywood Park 2-year-old sale and has trained with him on his nonviolent concepts and the language of the horse.

Monty and Pat's daughter and her husband, Debbie and Tom Loucks, have purchased the farm and will continue its operation under the California Horse Center banner. The center has begun several initiatives, including partnering with the Right Horse Initiative and the ASPCA in the Monty Roberts Mustang & Transition Horse Program for horses needing new homes through adoption. That program has now placed several dozen retired racehorses, mustangs, and other breeds.

SIR PRANCEALOT COLT TOPS SALE

CTBA NORCAL SALE MOVES IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION

A colt and a filly from the first California crop of Sir Prancealot brought two of the top three prices at the Aug. 17 California Thoroughbred Breeders Association Northern California sale of yearlings and horses of racing age. The colt brought \$50,000 to top the sale, held at the Alameda County Fairgrounds in Pleasanton, and the filly sold for \$40,000.

Robert Jones of San Leandro, Calif., led all other buyers at the sale with three for a total of \$90,000, which included the \$50,000 sale-topper, consigned by Adrian Gonzalez's Checkmate Thoroughbreds. The son of Sir Prancealot is out of the Union Rags mare Root Beer Rag. The second dam is graded winner Ask Me No Secrets.

"We foaled the mare out here and we've had him since he was born," said Gonzalez. "He just developed into a really grand-looking specimen: real strong, a lot of length to him, good forearm, gaskin. He was very powerful but also very classy on the end of the shank."

Gonzalez also sold a \$40,000 Sir Prancealot filly, who went to John Harris' Harris Farms. The filly is out of Frankly J'Ray, that mare a daughter of European superstar Frankel out of the multiple graded winner J'Ray.

"She had a very feminine look to her," said Gonzalez, who noted the filly's value as a potential broodmare with that pedigree. "She was very attractive and also had a powerful hip and shoulder. When John Harris got her, I was really excited because I know that's a super program."

Harris not only bought the Sir Prancealot filly, he also sold the top-priced filly and second-highest price over all. Harris Farms was the sale's leading consignor,

selling 12 for a total of \$206,200.

"We took a solid group of yearlings featuring our stallion roster, and I thought they sold really well," said Jonny Hilvers,

general manager of the Harris Farms horse division.

Trainer Andy Mathis purchased the top-priced filly, a daughter of deceased Vronsky, for \$45,000. The filly is out of the unraced Cyclotron mare Eden Mirelle, a half sister to California-bred M One Rifle, whose multiple graded wins include the 2009 Malibu Stakes (G1). Ronald Rand, the father of the Harris Farms resident veterinarian Dr. Courtney Stammerjohan, owns Eden Mirelle and bred the Vronsky filly.

Mathis' prowess with Cal-breds earned him the 2021 Trainer of the Year title from the CTBA, and he also bought a daughter of Clubhouse Ride for \$37,000. Sue Greene's Woodbridge Farm consigned the filly, who is out of the Tapit mare Beale Street Belle, a half sister to 2012 Del Mar Futurity (G1) winner Rolling Fog. It is the family of Horse of the Year Saint Liam.

Mathis' two purchases made him the second-leading buyer, behind Jones, with \$82,000, though the trainer also bought

a third horse as agent for Robert Bone for \$35,000. Harris Farms was the third-leading buyer, getting six for a total of \$80,000.

Barton Thoroughbreds, Lovacres Ranch, and Milky Way Farm each brought large consignments to the sale and sold almost all of them. Barton sold 31 of 33 offered, Lovacres 24 of 26, and Milky Way 20 of 23.

The low buy-back rate was a particular strength of the sale. Of the 134 offered, a total of 122 sold for only 12 buy-backs, or 9%. The 107 yearlings grossed \$909,100 for an average of \$8,496 and a median of \$4,500. All 15 horses of racing age offered were sold, to bring the gross to \$962,100.

Mathis bought the \$35,000 horse from Milky Way. Named Big Reveal, the colt is by Mr. Big—Be My Baby, by Artie Schiller. The mare is a half sister to \$763,770-earner

and graded stakes winner Kitten's Roar.

Mr. Big stands at Pete and Evelyn Parrilla's Legacy Ranch, and his progeny were doing well at Del Mar. Big City Lights captured the \$176,000 Real Good Deal Stakes Aug. 5, and The Big Wam added the \$126,000 Graduation Stakes Aug. 12.

Om stands at Harris Farms, and his first

foals are yearlings. Harris consigned a colt from that crop, and the youngster sold for \$32,000 to trainer Peter Miller. The colt is out of the Tiznow mare Tizn't Caught, who has already produced stakes-placed Caroline the Great. The second dam is Canadian champion Catch the Thrill.

Gonzalez noted that many of the horses had several bidders on them, another strength of the sale.

"The sale is making some huge strides," said Gonzalez, who also sits on the CTBA board of directors. "There were some updates with how the repository was run. Some of the conditions of the sale were updated. I think that's going to spawn some new interest from consignors.

"We really do need this second venue to sell yearlings. We need this NorCal sale to thrive." **CTB**

A DREAM FOR MIKE

FUN TO DREAM WINS FLEET TREAT STAKES AT DEL MAR

Heck Yeah surprised everybody: owner/breeder Mike Pageler, co-owners Bob Baedeker and Michael Sigband, and trainer Bob Baffert. The multiple stakes-winning California-bred's talent has led to even more success in the family, a bittersweet triumph because Pageler passed away in late 2018.

But before he died, Pageler knew about the coming foal now named Fun to Dream. His widow, Connie, is carrying on with the stable. She has partnered with Baffert's wife, Jill, in Fun to Dream, who crushed the opposition by 9¼ lengths in the \$175,000 Fleet Treat Stakes at Del Mar July 28.

Heck Yeah is by Acclamation out of the Maria's Mon mare Lutess, who was part of Baedeker's Live Your Dream Racing Stable. Baffert had claimed Lutess for the partnership, and after she finished racing, Pageler ended up with the mare.

Following Heck Yeah's success, Baffert had an idea. Connie and Mike had traveled to California from their home in Arizona for one of Heck Yeah's races not long after Baffert-trained Arrogate had won an Eclipse Award and had gone to stud.

"Bob Baffert was impressed by how well-defined Heck Yeah was," said Connie. "He was just talking and said, 'I wonder what kind (Lutess) would throw if she was bred to a horse like Arrogate?' Mike thought he was just kidding because that's a big deal, to use a breeding to a horse like Arrogate."

Baffert wasn't kidding and followed through, breeding Lutess to Arrogate in 2018.

"Mike was so excited about it," said Connie. "I don't think he

could believe his luck."

But Mike died in November and never got to see the filly. Connie was determined to continue Mike's dream.

"He loved it so," said Connie. "It brought him so much joy. He listened to the radio. He read every article that he could get his hands on. He really did his homework on horse racing."

Fun to Dream embodies Mike's love of racing. And karma being what it is, the Cal-bred filly is developing into an outstanding racehorse under Baffert's tutelage.

Connie and Baffert bred Fun to

Dream. The 3-year-old filly debuted for trainer Sean McCarthy, blasting to a maiden victory by 6¼ lengths at Santa Anita May 28.

Baffert returned from a suspension and had Fun to Dream primed for the seven-furlong Fleet Treat. Juan Hernandez, who rode her in the maiden race, was back aboard.

Fun to Dream raced in fourth early, moved up easily on the turn to take command, and cantered home well clear of the field, stopping the clock in 1:22.67. Second and third were Nick Alexander's stakes-winning Grazen duo Rose Dawson and Connie Swingle, a testament to the caliber of horses Fun to Dream was beating.

Though Connie has sold Lutess privately, she is happy she can pursue Mike's dream for him. And it isn't over. Not only is Fun to Dream's potential limitless, Connie has a 2-year-old colt by Smiling Tiger out of Lutess in training with Baffert. His name? Cowboy Mike. **CTB**

Big City Lights remains perfect with 2022 debut win in Real Good Deal Stakes at Del Mar

BIG CITY LIGHTS SHINES BRIGHTLY IN REAL GOOD DEAL

Big City Lights faced a tall order when returning from a 14-month layoff to start in the \$176,000 Real Good Deal Stakes at Del Mar Aug. 5. The credentials of his rivals were formidable: Slow Down Andy, a former Kentucky Derby prospect with a pair of graded victories against top competition; Finneus, named California's champion 2-year-old male of 2021; and Straight Up G, a multiple stakes winner. Stakes winners Smuggler's Run, Joker Boy, and Royal 'n Rando fleshed out the field.

Despite the layoff, the tremendous field, and a step up in trip to seven furlongs, Big

City Lights ran away from them like none of it mattered.

The California-bred son of Mr. Big—Champagne Exchange, by Exchange Rate, was unbeaten in two starts heading into the Real Good Deal, but had last been seen June 20, 2021. He won the \$100,000 Fasig-Tipton Futurity that day, scoring by a whopping 7¼ lengths over just five furlongs. Shortly thereafter, the exciting prospect had surgery to remove a knee chip and

went to the sidelines.

Moved from the barn of Luis Mendez to conditioner Richard Mandella, the dark bay colt kept his unbeaten streak intact when he went straight to the lead off a slightly slow start, took a commanding advantage, and rolled home 1¼ lengths clear. Slow Down Andy finished second, with Finneus third. The final time was 1:23.16.

Jockey Juan Hernandez was aboard for winning owner William Peeples, who resides in Santa Barbara.

"He broke well and was running well right from the start," Hernandez said. "Mr. Mandella told me to just play it as it comes up. He said I shouldn't take anything away from him. He got a little tired at the end, but he got it done. He's a nice horse."

A \$22,000 Fasig-Tipton California fall yearling sale purchase by Peeples in 2020, Big City Lights was bred by Pam and Neal Christopherson's Bar C Racing Stables. He isn't the first standout they've bred or co-bred, as California champion Galilean, graded stakes-placed Del Rio Harbor, and multiple stakes winner Carrabelle Harbor all hailed from their program.

Dam Champagne Exchange is also a Bar C homebred. Although she finished fourth in her only start, her dam Youcan'ttakeme was a multiple stakes winner when the Christophersons purchased her in 2012 and had already produced stakes winners Super Dixie and Hard Way Ten.

Champagne Exchange has proved to also be an excellent broodmare, as her first foal, a Cal-bred filly by Tapiture named Exchange Vows, was grade 2 placed at Del Mar last year. Big City Lights is Champagne Exchange's second, and she has a Harbor the Gold juvenile named Champ of Pagne who brought \$30,000 at auction last year. Champagne Exchange was bred back to Mr. Big for 2023.

The sky is the limit for Big City Lights now, who had a pair of bullet workouts to his credit leading into his return to the races. His three victories have earned him \$196,350. **CTB**

CARMELITA'S MAN MAKES CALIFORNIA DREAMIN' A REALITY

Del Mar track announcer Trevor Denman wasn't kidding when he called the Aug. 6 California Dreamin' Stakes "wide open at the top of the lane." Six horses were separated by two lengths, and as the horses approached the finish, four determined runners were heads apart. It was California-bred Carmelita's Man who snuck up the rail and snagged the victory on the line.

Jack Carava went to \$23,000 to purchase Carmelita's Man as a yearling in 2018 at the Barretts October yearling and horses of all ages sale for Santa Ynez-based owners Larry and Ann Jett. Carmelita's Man has now earned back \$362,038. The chestnut son of Mucho Macho Man—Carmelita, by North Light, was winning his second stakes race in a row, having scored in the \$100,000 Crystal Water Stakes May 28. With the California Dreamin' he ran his record to six wins, five seconds, and a third in 19 starts.

Carmelita's Man, a Dean Pederson trainee, had been a hard-knocking type, running well in allowance company but avoiding the leap into stakes competition until the Crystal Water. He was sent off as the favorite in the California Dreamin', a 1 $\frac{1}{16}$ -mile contest on the turf.

While 22-1 shot Bang for Your Buck and Hockey Dad vied for the lead early, jockey Juan Hernandez took Carmelita's

Man back to eighth in an 11-horse field, biding his time in a group that included the likes of California champion The Chosen Vron and grade 2 winner None Above the Law.

"He's the kind of horse you can do whatever you want with him," Hernandez said after the race. "I know this horse; I trust him a lot. I knew I had the horse, and I was just waiting for some room to come through."

Visually, Carmelita's Man had a lot of work to do swinging off the turn. Taking the shortest route along the rail, he needed racing room and a rally to win it. Hernandez found room, the horse found

the rally, and they surged to win by a head over Bang for Your Buck and The Chosen Vron.

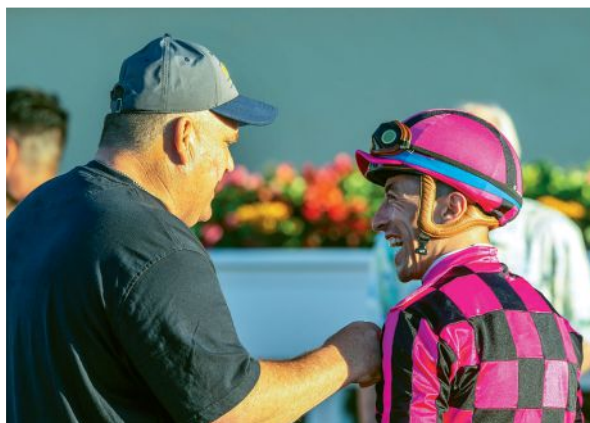
The photo was too close for Denman to declare a winner, and trainer Pederson hesitated.

"Until they put the numbers up, I was hoping for the best," he said. "The horse has been very honest and very consistent. We've spotted him well."

Carmelita's Man is the third foal to race and third winner out of winner Carmelita. Her 2016 full sister to Carmelita's Man, Kentucky-bred Buyback, has been stakes-placed three times this year, at Emerald Downs, Golden Gate Fields, and Pleasanton. Carmelita's Man is the mare's first stakes winner.

Success at Del Mar runs in the family: Second dam Cathrine's Hope, by In Excess, set a track record there in 2007, going 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ furlongs in 1:18.06. She was regarded well enough to run in grade 1 company later that season.

Carmelita's Man was bred by Richard Barton Enterprises and Robert Traynor, who also bred his 3-year-old Misremembered sibling. That colt, Goaline, is in training at Canyon Breeze Training Center in Utah. **CTB**

FAMILY TOUGHNESS

CHISMOSA ADDS FRESH BARK OF BLACK TYPE ON FAMILY TREE

When Chismosa won the \$126,000 California Thoroughbred Breeders' Association Stakes at Del Mar Aug. 7, the California-bred filly became the first stakes winner under either of her first two dams. But even if the number of black-type horses was lacking, one thing can be said for Chismosa's female family: They are tough as nails.

Chismosa is by the good California sire Clubhouse Ride, who was also durable, starting 43 times and winning such races as back-to-back editions of the Californian Stakes (G2). The filly is out of You Can Dream, a B. Wayne Hughes-bred daughter of Cat Dreams.

You Can Dream made 49 starts, with nine wins and 22 top-three efforts in a six-year career, then produced Nova with 44 starts, Queen Carmelita with 24, and Bella Renella with 28. All three were homebreds for Duarte-based Jaime Renella, also the owner/breeder of Chismosa.

Second dam Siphonophora, by Siphon, is a half sister to 2001 Kentucky Derby (G1) winner Monarchos, but she couldn't replicate his talent on the track, having just two off-the-board finishes in a short career. Siphonophora went on to produce not only You Can Dream, but 32-time starter Shownaphora, Wilburn's Princess with 17 starts, and Trending with 15 starts.

It was up to Chismosa to bring black type back into the rugged family, and she did that in spades in the CTBA Stakes. Chismosa's victory came on just 15 days' rest, but the Rafael DeLeon trainee channeled her resilient siblings and sprung a mild upset in the 5½-furlong, main-track contest.

Despite a slight hop at the start, she moved up steadily through the field and defeated seven rivals at 6-1 odds, scoring by 3½ lengths in 1:05.26. Chedda Cash finished second, with favored Sell the Dream third. E Z Pharis, Electric Lettuce, Fumano's Girl, Paddle On Polly, and Smiling Lady completed the order of finish.

Jockey Edgar Payeras was up on the winner, who is now unbeaten in two starts.

"She wanted to run and she did

all the work," Payeras said. "We broke a little slow, but she picked it up right from there. It's amazing when you have one that really 'wants to do it.'"

It was Payeras's first stakes victory at Del Mar and trainer DeLeon's second.

"I knew we had a nice horse," DeLeon said, admitting that he was heading to the winner's circle before the race was over. "I felt he (Payeras) was going to win."

The victory was reminiscent of her maiden win, at Del Mar July 23, when Chismosa settled toward the back of the pack and swooped to victory in the lane. Jockey Kyle Frey was up on that occasion because Payeras had been in a car accident on race day and missed the call. With Frey opting to commit to Lov U Mean It, who was scratched on CTBA Stakes morning, Payeras got his chance in the irons. The jockey is also Chismosa's regular work rider.

Chismosa has now earned \$119,250. She is one of seven stakes winners for her classy sire, Clubhouse Ride, who stands at Legacy Ranch in Clements. Clubhouse Ride has also sired star sprinter Brickyard Ride and the brilliant turf mare and Cal-bred champion Warren's Showtime. **CTB**

THE BIG WAM GRADUATES WITH BLACK TYPE AT DEL MAR

Mr. Big had a big effect on Golden State Series races at Del Mar this summer. Not only did he sire California-bred 3-year-old Big City Lights, winner of the \$176,000 Real Good Deal Stakes Aug. 5, he also sired 2-year-old The Big Wam, who captured the \$126,000 Graduation Stakes Aug. 12.

The stallion, who stands at Pete and Evelyn Parrella's Legacy Ranch, has had a say in recent Graduation runnings. The Big Wam followed California-bred Big Returns in 2019 as the second Graduation winner by Mr. Big.

The Big Wam has more than his sire in common with Big Returns. Luis Mendez trained both, as well as Positivity, a Cal-bred son of Paynter. Positivity captured the 2020 Graduation, giving Mendez

three of the last four winners.

Unlike Big Returns and Positivity, The Big Wam is a Washington-bred. Breeder Keith Marks asked Pam Christopherson of Oregon-based Bar C Racing Stables to find him an inexpensive mare in foal. Christopherson, breeder of Big City Lights, found a bargain at the 2020 California Thoroughbred Breeders Association mixed sale. She purchased the Forestry mare Magnetic from Harris Farms for just \$1,000.

Magnetic was carrying The Big Wam and foaled him in Washington May

23. Marks bred her back to Harbor the Gold, who stood at Christopherson's farm. Magnetic's 2021 filly is one of the final foals by the stallion; Christopherson said that Harbor the Gold died in 2021. Harbor the Gold's runners include California Diamond, the champion Cal-bred 2-year-old male of 2016.

Marks sold The Big Wam privately, and the colt made his first start for owner Charles Bartlett under Mendez' tutelage. The Big Wam ran second April 28 in a 4½-furlong maiden race at Keeneland.

The Big Wam earned black type in his next outing, the five-furlong Kentucky Juvenile Stakes at Churchill Downs. In against 11 others, he ran second to Cal-bred Tom's Regret.

By the time Del Mar began, Michael Bello had bought into the colt. The Big Wam broke his maiden July 23 as the 2-5 favorite in a five-furlong Cal-bred/California-sired maiden race.

In the 5½-furlong Graduation, The Big Wam, piloted by leading rider Juan Hernandez, went off as the 7-10 favorite. Second-to-last early, he began passing horses on the outside going into the turn. The Big Wam reached third midway on the turn, and Hernandez pointed him for pacesetting Straighten Up.

Straighten Up, who completed the first quarter-mile in :21.90 and the half in :44.82, could not hold off The Big Wam's onslaught. The Big Wam defeated Straighten Up by a length in 1:04.59, with Good N Thirsty third.

"He broke a little slow and then wanted to get out," said Hernandez. "On the turn, though, he started moving."

The rider said that The Big Wam preferred the outside and won despite not changing leads.

"He was really running at the end and got it done," Hernandez said.

Mendez wasn't thrilled with The Big Wam's having drawn post position 2 because there was so much speed in the race.

"But thank God he likes to come from behind," said the trainer. "He's shown that on every single race." **CTB**

SWEET AS CANDY

WARRENS CANDY GIRL WINS SOLANA BEACH AT DEL MAR

Ben and Sally Warren have a good combination going: Breed an Affirmative mare to Clubhouse Ride and put Craig Lewis in charge of training the offspring. It worked so well with Warren's Showtime that she earned the 2020 champion California-bred 3-year-old female award and 2021 champion Cal-bred older female award. Now the Warrens have Warrens Candy Girl, who won the Aug. 21 Solana Beach Stakes at Del Mar.

In the case of Warren's Showtime, the Affirmative mare was Warren's Veneda, also trained by Lewis and the 2015 champion Cal-bred older female. Primarily due to Warren's Showtime, Warren's Veneda was named the 2020 California Broodmare of the Year.

Lewis trained Clubhouse Ride, and the Warrens have bred mares to the California sire with excellent results. One of those was Warren's Jitterbug, bred by Ben Warren, who raced the multiple stakes winner and earner of \$355,994. Warren's Jitterbug ran second in the 2011 Solana Beach to millionaire and Cal-bred champion Halo Dolly.

Also a daughter of Affirmative, Warren's Jitterbug produced Warrens Candy Girl to the cover of Clubhouse Ride in 2018. Close to breaking her maiden several times at 2 in 2020, Warrens Candy Girl in her first 2021 start, and still a maiden, ran second in the Leigh Ann Howard California Cup Oaks. The winner, Closing Remarks, went on to become the year's champion Cal-bred 3-year-old female.

Since then, Warrens Candy Girl has developed into a useful allowance winner. A week before the Solana Beach, she

captured an allowance/optional claiming race at Del Mar, defeating Irish-bred Ap-plecross, a stakes-placed daughter of Sir Prancealot.

Lewis decided to bring Warrens Candy Girl back for the Solana Beach at a mile on the turf. It was no easy task. She faced a field that included stakes winner and graded stakes-placed Eddie's New Dream, the only horse to finish ahead of multiple graded winner Becca Taylor; 2020-21 Solana Beach winner Pulpit Rider; stakes winner Rose Dawson; and three stakes-placed runners.

When the gate opened, Warrens Can-

dy Girl broke well from post 2 and jockey Umberto Rispoli let her run behind the early lead of Harper's Gallop, saving ground along the rail. Down the backstretch, Eddie's New Dream raced in third, with Warrens Candy Girl fourth.

Eddie's New Dream ranged up three wide around the second turn to challenge for the lead, grabbing the top spot as they turned for home. Warrens Candy Girl angled out for the battle with Eddie's New Dream, and those two fought hard all the way down the stretch. Warrens Candy Girl edged the game even-money favorite by a head in 1:35.23.

"Just before the chute I knew I was going to get her," said Rispoli.

Lewis noted what a good finisher Warrens Candy Girl is.

"She was laying closer than we are used to seeing her, but the pace was slow and Umberto did a great job," the trainer said. "Our future plans are to give her a rest because she came back in a week. She did what she had to do, and we're pleased with her performance." **CTB**

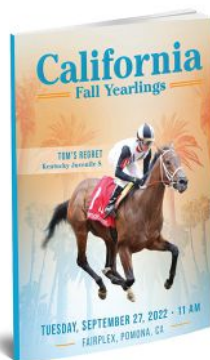

LOT OF APPLES UNDER FASIG'S BLACK-TYPE CAL-BRED TREE

Tom's Regret is the best kind of marketing a sales company could want. The California-bred filly sold at last year's Fasig-Tipton California yearling sale, became a stakes winner, and has a half brother by a promising California sire in this year's catalog. Is it any wonder Tom's Regret is the catalog cover girl?

That half brother is only one of many Cal-breds by good sires with plenty of black type in the family on offer at the Fasig-Tipton yearling sale. To be held Sept. 27 at Fairplex in Pomona beginning at 11 a.m., the sale—in just its fourth year—has quickly become an important event in the California Thoroughbred industry. The catalog has 279 yearlings, and the sale will also have a supplemental catalog of horses of racing age.

Rancho San Miguel has consigned the half brother to Tom's Regret. The colt, hip #263, is by Sir Prancealot—Pure, by Quality Road. Tom's Regret in just her second start won the May 5 Kentucky Juvenile Stakes at Churchill Downs



against males and then finished second in the June 18 Fasig-Tipton Debutante Stakes at Santa Anita.

Sir Prancealot stands at Rancho San Miguel, and Adrian Gonzalez of Checkmate Thoroughbreds was a principal in bringing the horse to California. Between them, Rancho San Miguel and Checkmate will offer 15 by Sir Prancealot. Other consignors with yearlings by the sire are Easterbrook Livestock Management, Fairview, Goda Bloodstock, Havens Bloodstock Agency, and McCarthy Bloodstock.

These are Sir Prancealot's first California foals, though he already has several good stakes winners from his earlier crops when standing in Europe and Australia. He continues to shuttle to Australia.

Many of the Sir Prancealot yearlings in the catalog have plenty of black type, some of it very familiar to California breeders. McCarthy Bloodstock's Sir Prancealot filly, hip #143, is out of the stakes-winning Lydgate mare Do Dat Blues, the dam of Cal-bred stakes winner Mo See Cal.

Hip #275, a Sir Prancealot colt consigned by Checkmate, is out of the stakes-winning Cal-bred Tribal Rule mare Rockella. That mare has produced stakes-placed Cal-bred Heat the Rocks, who in turn is the dam of current runner Rose Maddox, already stakes-placed.

Rose Maddox is by Grazen, a leading California sire who has 10 yearlings in the catalog. Bruno DeBerd's Excel Bloodstock is offering Grazen Bran, hip #48 and a son of Grazen—Tribal Feathers, by Tribal Rule. Tribal Feathers has also produced Cal-bred Tribal Storm, a multiple stakes winner and earner of \$361,070.

Cal-bred champion California Diamond has a full brother in the catalog. Critter Creek Farm has consigned Ten of Diamonds, hip #117, a Cal-bred son of Harbor the Gold out of the stakes-placed Slewddledo mare Carrie's a Jewel.

Stay Thirsty led California sires last year in several categories, and he will be represented by 22 in the catalog. Terry Lovingier's Lovacres Ranch has consigned all 22 of them, including hip #109, a colt out of the Bertrando mare Brilliant Melody, who has also produced stakes winner Fast Enough, and hip #125, a colt out of the Orb mare Chasing Moments from the family of grade 1 winner Charlatan.

Mr. Big is another California sire whose progeny are making headlines. He has 14 in the catalog, including hip #256, a full brother to Cal-bred champion and multiple stakes winner Big Fish, and hip #228, named Big Slew and a full brother to multiple stakes winner Big Sweep. Havens Bloodstock Agency has consigned both.

The catalog includes Cal-bred yearlings by out-of-state sires as well. Goldencents, sire of the \$150,000 sale-topper sold by Fairview in 2019, has six in the catalog, all foaled in California. Fairview has two of them: hip #96, a gelding out of the stakes-winning Ministers Wild Cat mare Bella Luma, and #169, a daughter of the stakes-winning Rockport Harbor mare Harbor Mist. Talent for Gold, hip #79, is a daughter of Goldencents consigned by Harris Farms as agent for Casadega Farms and a half sister to stakes winner Hillbilly Royalty.

California stallions whose first foals are yearlings will also be represented. Om, Pavel, and Rumpus Cat all have members of their first crop in the Fasig-Tipton catalog. **CTB**

LARRY AND ANN JETT

In Larry Jett's mind, he probably had a future Kentucky Derby winner, but Red Ralph never hit the board.

After years of attending the races as a fan, Jett, along with wife Ann, had purchased his first California-bred Thoroughbred. There were high hopes for Red Ralph, a chestnut gelding by M. Double M.—Jakscent, by Jaklin Klugman.

"The fellow that owned him couldn't have him anymore, so I bought the horse for \$5,000," Larry

said. "Within two days of working him in the round pen, he came up lame. The former owner said that if we paid for the vet, they would give us our money back." He added wryly, "Keep in mind, this was the future Kentucky Derby winner."

It turned out that Red Ralph had osteochondritis dissecans (OCD), and surgery to clean out the joint didn't help when he bucked shins not once, but twice. Still, the Jetts remained optimistic.

"His first race came as a 4-year-old at Del Mar," Larry said. "I had a full entourage

with me."

Red Ralph rewarded their patience by finishing eighth of nine horses, and promptly dumped jockey Alex Solis after the race.

"So, that was my first experience," Jett said.

Ann added, "I had never been around racing before. That was my first introduction to racing and ownership."

She wasn't quite sure what all the fuss was about.

They could have packed it in, but didn't, which has led to Cal-bred Carmelita's Man, who has won back-to-back stakes. In 2004, the Jetts, with Lewis and Donna Cenicola, bred an In Excess mare named Cathrine's Hope. She was named after Larry's mother, who had introduced him to racing in the 1950s. Lewis Cenicola had been the exercise rider of the great John Henry and trained for the Jetts before his death in 2012.

"My mom loved to go, and she'd let me tag along," Larry recalled. "Cathrine's Hope was a hard-trying mare."

Cookin Vickie, the dam of Cathrine's Hope, was graded stakes-placed in 1999 and earned \$232,627 from 28 starts. Cathrine's Hope inherited some of that toughness, earning \$259,162 with five wins in 23 tries. She was eventually sold as a broodmare for \$23,000.

Time went on and horses filtered in and out of the Jetts' lives, bringing both disappointments and mystical thrills. There was the time they left the funeral service of a dear friend where the renowned song "Somewhere

Over the Rainbow” had been played, made it to Hollywood Park in time to watch one of their horses—Cathrine’s Hope’s half brother, Cookinthisorthat—race, heard the same song on their way to their seats, and saw him win.

“Coincidence, or something else?” Jett mused.

The Munnings filly Miss Lady Ann broke her maiden in her second start, scoring by 3¾ lengths at Santa Anita. Dark Nose, a Bertrando half brother to Cathrine’s Hope, won a pair of races in 2005 and 2006, and even defeated subsequent \$114,939 Derby Trial Stakes winner Record in an allowance race at Santa Anita.

The Jetts tried claiming horses but preferred to bring them up from birth. They were still waiting on a “big horse” when they got a call from trainer-turned-bloodstock agent Jack Carava.

“He was at the Barretts sale in 2018 and saw this horse come into the ring,” Jett said. “He looked up the pedigree and what did he see? The second dam was Cathrine’s Hope. He bought the yearling (for \$23,000) then asked me if I wanted to buy him. That is Carmelita’s Man.”

Carmelita’s Man is a chestnut Cal-bred gelding by Mucho Macho Man—Carmelita, by North Light. Carmelita scored at Woodbine in 2013. She was sold to Richard Barton Enterprises while carrying Carmelita’s Man.

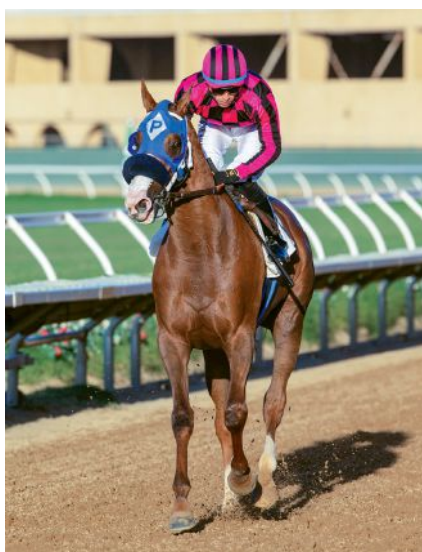
In training with Dean Pederson, Carmelita’s Man took four tries to break his maiden, but did so at Santa Anita Oct. 9, 2020. He added a starter optional claiming victory three weeks later and another starter in January of 2021. The gritty gelding bounced around in allowance company, running up a strong record, before finally

trying a higher level in the \$100,000 Crystal Water Stakes at Santa Anita May 28.

Sent off as the favorite against tough competitors such as Jimmy Blue Jeans

and Irish Heatwave, Carmelita’s Man rallied from last to win by three-quarters of a length.

“We were there and it was so exciting,” Ann said. “And I really enjoy seeing how excited Larry gets.”

“I wash out faster than the horses,” Larry joked.

Ann wasn’t able to be in attendance for Carmelita’s Man’s second

stakes start, the \$152,500 California Dreamin’ Stakes at Del Mar Aug. 6, but Carmelita’s Man split a wall of horses and rallied up the rail to score by a head in the 1¼-mile contest.

“I was ill and couldn’t make it, but I was so happy for Larry and excited because I knew he was excited,” Ann said.

The victory pushed Carmelita’s Man’s record to six wins, five seconds, and a third in 19 starts for earnings of \$362,038. While the Kentucky Derby is out of the question for the 5-year-old turf horse, the Jetts finally have a horse who has made all the previous disappointments worth it.

“My old trainer Lewis once said to me, ‘Larry, you better be wearing steel shorts because there’s a lot of ups and downs in this business,’” Jett recalled.

But there could be more ups on the horizon: their homebred American Cat, a Cal-bred sophomore by American Freedom, debuted at Del Mar Aug. 7 and ran a promising fourth. The 3-year-old Sky Mesa filly Sky Maker has finished in the top three spots in seven of eight starts this year in Northern California, and the Jetts have five 2-year-olds, including a daughter of Cairo Prince out of the Candy Ride mare Candy n’ Oats who has been working well.

“We don’t own a boat, but we own horses,” Larry said. And the horses are a much more compelling reward. **CTB**

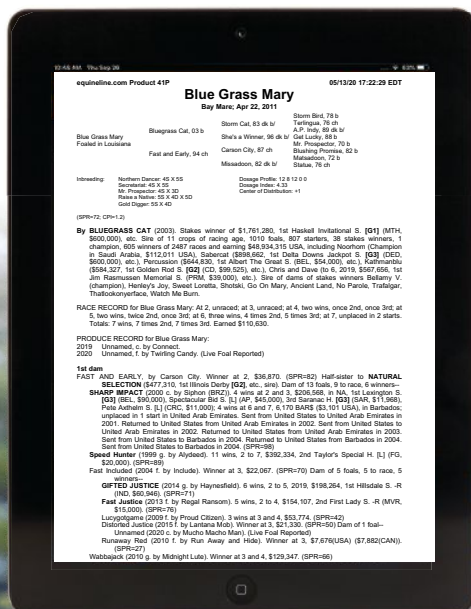

IS IT ESTRUS?

Changes in mare behavior might be caused by things other than the estrous cycle

POSSIBLE CAUSES OF AND TECHNIQUES TO MANAGE BAD BEHAVIOR IN MARES

Mares often exhibit changes in behavior relative to their estrous cycles. Sometimes the behavior is extreme enough that it interferes with their management, training, or performance.

Often when a mare behaves badly, her attitude and actions are blamed on estrus. But in some instances the unwanted behavior could stem from some other problem. Figuring out what is causing the behavior must be the first step in trying to address it in a positive way.

Dr. Ahmed Tibary, professor of theriogenology at the department of veterinary clinical sciences at Washington State University, says mare behavior is a huge concern in competition horses if it interferes with their job or ease of handling.

"Usually the first thought is to blame the ovaries," Tibary said. "But the challenge is to prove whether the behavior is actually related to hormones during the estrous cycle. Determining whether it is linked to hormones can become very involved with many examinations.

"When clients tell me their mare is cranky, difficult to handle, or not performing well, they often ask if they should stop her cycles. But we have to determine whether this behavior is actually due to her cycle, so I recommend that they keep a journal noting the dates and the mare's behavior.

"We have to also establish what the behavior is. It might be signs of estrus, but it may be due to other things. The first thing I ask is whether this mare has been doing this behavior for quite a while or did she just start exhibiting

this behavior. Is it happening in spring and summer or in November and December when many mares are not actually cycling?

“Define the behavior and keep a journal to record the observed behavior. People can also make a video to show exactly what the mare is doing. This is easier than to accurately describe it in words and is very useful for comparisons.”

Tibary also has the owner use a grading system for classification of the behavior—starting at zero. At zero, you would say she is totally normal, very relaxed and cooperative under saddle, with no crankiness. At a score of one, she might be distracted or not quite her normal self. At two, she is mildly displaying a different behavior or signs of estrus, and at three, she is strongly displaying this kind of behavior.

“If a person can also get videos of the behavior, that helps us determine if it’s estrus related,” he said.

An advantage for a racehorse in training is that the trainer and veterinarian often are evaluating each horse every day, which helps monitor a filly or mare’s behavior.

“When she is at zero, we can check her and see what her ovaries are doing, and examine her again when she’s at three, to see what the ovaries are doing—and keep the journal,” Tibary said. “If she is at zero for 12 to 14 days, and then goes to a one, a two, and then remains at three for several days, this indicates to me that she was coming into estrus and is now in a full-blown estrus. The journal and daily activities can help point to whether this is related to her ovaries or not.”

KEEP HER FROM CYCLING?

If the mare is exhibiting unwanted behavior during estrus, many clients opt to try something to halt her estrous cycles, especially if she is in a high-performance career.

“This sparks discussion regarding what works and what doesn’t,” Tibary said. “There is a lot of hearsay on what works. Many people believe in certain treatments or protocols that have not been proven scientifically to work.

“The treatments that have been proven to work best—to stop a mare from showing signs of estrus—is the administration of either straight progesterone or the analog (synthetic progestogen, which is altrenogest or Regumate). There are other types of progestogen that people have tried, that work on other species—and they may swear by those treatments—but the scientific evidence is not there to prove that those types of progestogens work in mares for this particular indication.”

Another possibility for suppression of heat cycles or ovarian activity suppression is using a vaccine against the hormone GnRH.

“Ovarian activity is controlled by gonadotrophin, which is regulated by GnRH pulses,” Tibary said. “Immunization of mares against GnRH induces anti-GnRH antibodies that bind to

the GnRH and keep it from binding to receptors on the pituitary gland, removing the stimulus for gonadotropin secretion. This results in decreased ovarian activity and the mare does not ovulate or come into estrus. There has been a lot of research on this for control

of feral horse population, but no product is yet approved in the U.S.”

A vaccine is in use in Australia, but it is not advised for mares ever likely to be intended for breeding. In one study some young Thoroughbred mares that were vaccinated never returned to proper cycling when the vaccine was stopped.

“Other treatments have been tried to block mares from showing estrus,” said Tibary. “Intrauterine devices have historically been used for this purpose, since this technique can prolong the luteal phase of the cycle, keeping the mare from coming into estrus for a variable period of time. Prevention of cyclicity in mares and female camels by placing a date pit in the uterus is a common practice in many Bedouin tribes. Dutch veterinarians adapted this technique by using intrauterine glass balls (marbles).”

This technique was popular for a while, but is not in use much today.

“The glass marbles inserted into the uterus do block estrus for a period of time, ranging from 45 to 60 days, in about 40 to 60% of the mares,” Tibary said. “There is some danger associated with use of marbles, however. People have been using them in the U.S. for more than 20 years, but in the past few years there have been reports of marbles breaking or creating damage. This possibility makes me reluctant to use them.

“A recent technique that is attractive as a safe way to suppress heat is to give the mare oxytocin. Studies have shown that if you give daily intramuscular injections of oxytocin, starting the seventh day after ovulation and continuing until the 14th day (for about a week), you create a situation of pseudo-pregnancy. The mare thinks she is pregnant and maintains her corpus luteum, which keeps her own progesterone level high. Therefore, she does not come into estrus.

“This works on about 60 to 80% of mares, depending on which studies you look at, and mares stop cycling for up to two months with this treatment. Some veterinarians are now going this route with clients who want to halt estrous behavior in their mares.”



The drawback of using oxytocin in this manner is that you would have to know when the mare has actually ovulated.

"A study was done to find a way to try to avoid doing that and found that if you start the mare on the oxytocin injections at any time during her cycle and give them for 29 days, you can achieve the same results. She will not come into heat again for as much as two months."

If a mare is given this many injections, a person must be careful to use very clean and proper injection techniques to avoid injection-site reactions or infections. The injections are generally given in the neck, alternating from one side to the other when giving the 29 injections. You do not want to make the neck sore.

"I have not used that technique (the 29 days), but I have used the seven-day regime—knowing when the mare has ovulated," Tibary said. "My clients have been happy with the results."

"When the research first came out, I was concerned about it because injection of oxytocin requires a fairly high dose. I was concerned that this much would make the mare have uterine cramps, but when we had an AAEP (American Association of Equine Practitioners) forum, I posed this question to the veterinarians who have done it with many mares. No one had observed any problems, and when I started using this technique, I didn't see any trouble with it either."

"We just need to be very careful when giving any injections because the last thing you want is an abscess or a clostridial infection. Unfortunately, we do see a clostridial myositis every now and then from an injection."

"Some mares have more exuberant estrus than others. There are some theories that it's not so much the estrus as it is the change in hormones that makes some mares cranky, but I don't know of any studies that have shown this. But we do wonder if it's partly the changes,

when some of these particular behaviors cannot be explained."

It's not always a simple issue to figure out and resolve the behavioral problems in mares.

"Removing estrus is actually the easiest thing to tackle, either with injections or feeding the mare Regumate," Tibary said. "There are many things that may be obvious behavioral changes, such as hypersensitivity, sensitive when you put the saddle on, etc."

BEHAVIOR ABNORMALITIES

Sometimes the changes in behavior, or even some of the signs we think of as estrus, are actually due to other factors or diseases. There can also be abnormalities in cycles that might cause mares to remain in heat for a long time.

"The normal transition from anestrus (in winter) to cyclicity again in the spring may be long," Tibary said. "As mares come out of anestrus, cycles may be very erratic and they may remain in

estrus for a long period of time. Some experience a phenomenon we call split estrus, where they show estrus for a few days, then skip a couple of days, then come back in heat again, during that transition. These erratic cycles continue until they establish their first ovulation."

Some mares exhibit aggressive behavior, which might or might not be caused by their cycles.

"We have seen many mares that develop extreme aggressive behavior and become very dangerous without any obvious abnormalities of the ovaries or any other system," Tibary said. "I have also seen cases where mares change behavior when they are moved to a new environment with new horses."

The abnormality of the ovary that most commonly leads to abnormal behavior is a granulosa-theca cell tumor.

"Aggressive, stallion-like behavior is generally due to abnormally high levels of steroid hormones from a hormone-producing tumor," said Tibary. "About 40% of granulosa cell tumors contain thecal cells that produce testosterone, though mares with granulosa cell tumors may show a variety of signs. About 20% show continuous estrus and about 25% appear to be in anestrus, never showing signs of heat."

"We've had mares that within a few days went from being very calm to becoming very dangerous to anyone around them. Some of these mares will aggressively attack other horses and may herd, tease, or mount other mares. The only way to address this problem is to remove the diseased ovary."

"The technique for removing that ovary, which we use here at WSU, is minimally invasive. The surgeon just goes in with a laparoscope and takes the ovary out in small pieces. We don't need to open up the flank, like we did in the past. This new technique is much easier on mares."

If mares have behavioral problems that are linked to normal ovarian activity, the owner might choose the option of having both ovaries removed. If she is never going to be a broodmare, this could be a solution.

“There are some studies and observations, however, showing that some of the mares that have had ovaries removed become persistently receptive to or showing to the stallion, similar to some spayed female cats,” said Tibary. “By spaying the mare, you remove all of the hormonal control of behavior. More than 70% will no longer show signs of estrus after spaying, but a small percentage will still show some of the signs.

“There are other reasons why mares might show undesirable behavior, and it may or may not be related to reproductive cycles. For example, some clients tell us about mares that are occasionally very sensitive in the flank area, or under saddle, or don’t want to turn a certain way.

“The first reaction is thinking that the ovary on that side is ovulating and possibly painful. If you work up these mares, you’d have to remove all other sources of pain in order to prove this. Back pain is one possibility, which is difficult to sort out.”

Low-grade orthopedic problems might first show up as a change in behavior and performance due to the discomfort, rather than as an obvious lameness.

“When a mare starts showing un-

wanted behavior, we try to figure out whether there have been any changes in the way the mare is managed or changes in nutrition or in training/riding,” said Tibary. “I discuss this with the clients and feel their frustration—because we cannot reach a simple diagnosis on one veterinary visit. We keep trying to figure out what is wrong with that mare.”

A number of things can be mistaken for estrous behavior, such as mares that twitch the tail continually when ridden, lean a certain way, or rub against fences.

“They may emit small jets of fluid or urine and posture like they are urinating” Tibary said. “These behaviors might seem like signs of estrus, but can be signs of a urinary/bladder infection or a vaginitis.”

Any medical condition that creates irritation or discomfort in the vagina or

urinary tract can cause a mare to show signs such as a raised tail, frequent attempts to urinate, etc. that might be confused with signs of estrus.

“In Thoroughbreds, a lot of mares develop vaginitis when they become fit because they tend to become wind-suckers,” Tibary said. “The anus sinks forward and feces/fluid from defecation may fall into the vulva and create irritation and infection. This is why most of Thoroughbred fillies in training have a Caslick’s procedure, to prevent this. Then they don’t become irritated and unable to focus on training.”

In some situations, a timid mare might squirt urine when she cowers in response to what she perceives as a threat. But these mares generally clamp the tail and do not show the other typical signs of estrus.

There are also mares that have painful ovulation, and it’s not the estrus itself that makes them cranky, but the pain of ovulation. This could create colic signs as well as a cranky attitude.

“Mares with severe abdominal pain may also hemorrhage into the ovary and develop a hematoma in the ovary,” said Tibary.

It is always important to determine the reason for the mare’s behavior and then address it appropriately, rather than just assuming it is due to estrus. Evaluation of the mare is crucial before beginning any kind of therapy or techniques for modifying her behavior. **CTB**

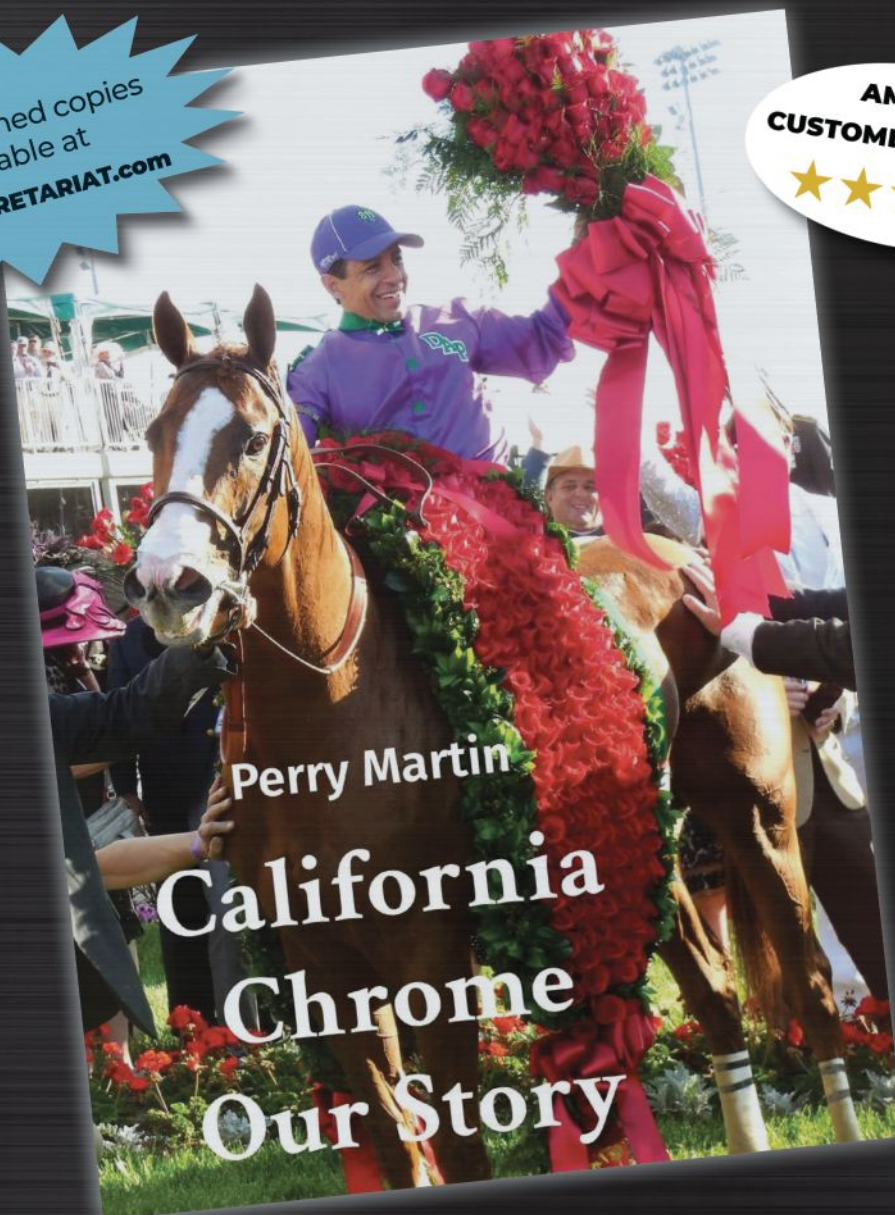
