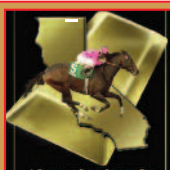

Teddy's Promise ran the seven furlongs in 1:22.64 and won by three lengths as the 3-2 favorite. Fellow Cal-bred Sugarinthemorning was second in the field of seven.

Sierra Sunset, a son of Bertrando, won the grade II Rebel Stakes and stands at Rancho San Miguel for a \$2,500 fee.

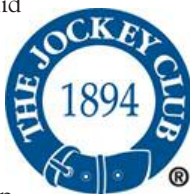
The Jockey Club Deadline To Name 2011 Foals Is Friday, February 1

The Jockey Club reminds owners and breeders that a valid attempt to name foals of 2011 must be made by Friday, February 1, 2013, to avoid a \$100 late fee.

As an aid in selecting a desired name, in December The Jockey Club published a list of approximately 46,000 names released from active use. A majority of the released names are from horses more than 10 years old that have not raced or been used for breeding during the preceding five years. Names selected from the list for re-use are subject to approval by The Jockey Club.

Names selections can be submitted to The Jockey Club from the registry website or can be submitted via mobile applications developed for the popular iOS and Android platforms. The Naming Application is available for download free of charge and provides customers with a fast and convenient means to reserve, change, or claim a name for their Thoroughbred.

"The Jockey Club's online and mobile resources offer owners and breeders an efficient, convenient method to research and decide on names for their Thoroughbreds," said Matt Iuliano, The Jockey Club's executive vice president and executive director. "The list of recently released names can be reviewed for suggestions and the Online Names Book is an invaluable tool to compare potential choices to currently in-use names."



The list of recently released names and the Online Names Book are updated daily as names are claimed. Please visit the Registry's homepage at registry.jockeyclub.com or Registry mobile at mobile.registry.jockeyclub.com for more information.

Interactive Registration™ is the most efficient means to submit name applications to the Registry. Name applications submitted through Interactive Registration are preliminarily screened to eliminate direct matches with names unavailable for use. Owners who name their Thoroughbreds through Interactive Registration receive their first choice approximately 75 percent of the time. More than 1.3 million Interactive Registration transactions have been recorded since its launch in 1996.

Unusual Heat Maintains Stranglehold On California Sire Lists In 2012

Unusual Heat continued his reign as California's leading sire for the fifth consecutive year in 2012. Judging from his attitude in recent weeks, there may be no change to the rankings in the near future.

On a recent visit to Harris Farms in central California, stallion owner Madeline Auerbach witnessed firsthand the vivacity of the 23-year-old son of Nureyev.

"We make a habit of coming once a month to see him," Auerbach said. "They had been moving some mares. He was [upset]. He ran to the fence and started hollering. He was questioning where the mares were. When I saw that, I thought: He wants another breeding season.

The five-year-old ran the 1 1/16 in 1:46.60 and won by 1 3/4 lengths as the 1-10 favorite.

Variety Road Passes At 30

Multiple grade I winner Variety Road, a California-bred who also stood stallion duty, was euthanized due to infirmities of old age on January 14. He was 30.

Variety Road's 22 crops earned more than \$2.8 million. On the track, Variety Road won 17 of 59 starts, \$964,540 and captured grade I wins in the 1986 San Felipe Stakes and the 1987 San Fernando Stakes.

Variety Road was bred and owned by longtime California Thoroughbred Breeders Association (CTBA) member Kjell Qvale.

"He was the opposite in disposition to his sire Kennedy Road. The kindest sweetest stallion to be around," said Shirley Hansen, who cares for some of Qvale's retired horses with her husband, Roger, on their Idaho farm.

"He ran some great races in California on dirt, turf, mud, long or short. He won stakes at the age of 8, two years after he started covering mares."

Hansen said Variety Road will be buried with a marker on her family's farm, which they purchased from Qvale.

New Head Of California Operations For Stronach

Keith Brackpool has entered into an agreement to acquire a minor stake in The Stronach Group. The company's Racing and Gaming Group announced January 19 that Brackpool has joined the group's board of directors and has been appointed chairman of its operations in California.

Music Genre's Effect On Horse Behavior Evaluated

Stalled horses seemed at ease when classical or country music was played and displayed nervous behavior when listening to rock or jazz.

Ever thought of "jazzing" up your stables? Or getting your horses to "rock 'n' roll" in the stall? Better reconsider your music choices. According to British researchers, classical and country sounds are probably best for equine welfare.

To test the effects of different kinds of music on stabled horses, Clare Carter, BSc, of Hartpury College in Gloucester, England, and her supervisor Linda Greening, MSc, also of Hartpury College, studied eight Thoroughbred geldings that had been stabled for three hours. They played four different kinds of music--classical (Beethoven), country (Hank Williams Jr.), rock (Green Day), and jazz (New Stories)--for 30 minutes each. The researchers recorded detailed behavior observations (120 per horse per genre) according to an equine ethogram (a catalogue of all behaviors or actions exhibited by horses). They also observed the horses' behavior for 30 minutes without music. Greening presented the results of their study at the 2012 conference of the International Society for Equitation Science.—continued at www.theHorse.com, By [Christa Lesté-Lasserre](#)

California Cup Moved to Early 2014 As Part Of Revamped Golden State Series

The California Cup will not be run in 2013, but will be moved to a date in January or early February at Santa Anita Park in 2014 as part of a revamped Golden State series for California-breds over the next 12 months.

The California Thoroughbred Breeders Association (CTBA) released its 2013-2014 Golden State series schedule on Thursday, and the revised date for the Cal Cup is the most significant of several changes.

Formed in 1990, the California Cup has been run each fall since its inception. The move to a mid-winter date is designed to boost an event that had struggled in recent years to draw attendance and handle support.

The new Cal Cup program will feature a \$250,000 Cal Cup Classic, worth \$75,000 more than in 2012. The race has been switched from turf to dirt, while the distance remains 1 1/8 miles. Instead of the previously run Juvenile and Juvenile Fillies, the races for the foals of 2011 in 2014 will be a Derby and Oaks. The purses remain the same, at \$250,000.

Four other races are scheduled to be run on the proposed program: the \$125,000 Distaff for fillies and mares over about 6 1/2 furlongs on the hillside turf course; the \$100,000 Sprint over six furlongs on dirt; the \$100,000 Valentine Dancer Stakes for females over a mile on turf; and the \$100,000 Crystal Water Stakes over a mile on turf.

The Sunshine Millions was run on Saturday at Santa Anita, consisting of four stakes for California-breds: two \$300,000 divisions of the California Breeders' Champion Stakes as well as the Valentine Dancer and Crystal Water Stakes.

There were also two graded stakes: the grade II, \$250,000 Santa Monica Stakes for female sprinters and the Grade 3 \$100,000 Santa Ysabel Stakes for three-year-old fillies.

The move to a January or February date is designed to revive the event, according to organizers.



"We wanted to merge the Sunshine Millions with the Cal Cup races and offer more what we used to offer of just stakes on Cal Cup Day," said Doug Burge, the executive director of the CTBA.

"The Cal Cup has suffered in the fall from an attendance and handle standpoint. We wanted to find a way to revitalize that."

The Golden State series was launched in 2012, featuring 27 races, primarily for two- and three-year-olds, between February 2012 and Saturday's program at Santa Anita. The calendar of Golden State series races for 2013 and the first two months of 2014 features 33 races.

The new races include five stakes for older horses that were on the racing calendar in 2012 or early this year, but were not part of the Golden State program. Three of those races—the Fran's Valentine Stakes for fillies and mares at Betfair Hollywood Park in May, and the On Trust Handicap and Cat's Cradle Handicap (for female sprinters) at Hollywood Park in the fall—have had their purses enhanced from \$75,000 to \$100,000.

The Valentine Dancer and Crystal Water are part of the Golden State series for the first time in early 2014. The newly created race is the \$100,000 California Flag on the hillside turf course at Santa Anita in the fall.

Two turf races at Del Mar have had purses increased by \$50,000, to \$150,000: the California Dreamin' and the Solana Beach for fillies and mares. The Melair Stakes for 3-year-old fillies at Hollywood Park in April has been cut by \$50,000, to \$250,000.—[continued at www.DRF.com](http://www.DRF.com), *By Steve Andersen*

Investment Incentives Reinstated and Increased

The fiscal cliff tax legislation passed by Congress and signed by President Obama earlier this week reinstated two business investment incentives that were scheduled to either expire or be significantly reduced for 2013. Bonus depreciation will remain at 50% as it was in 2012. The expense allowance will be increased to \$500,000 in 2013 and retroactively increased from \$125,000 to \$500,000 for property purchased in 2012.

These incentives may be used by businesses in the Thoroughbred industry and are designed to encourage investment and boost the economy.

Here's a closer look at bonus depreciation and the expense allowance for 2013:

Bonus Depreciation

- 50% bonus depreciation is in place for 2013.
- Applies to new property only; its original use must commence with the taxpayer.
- Applies to horses, farm equipment and most other depreciable property.
- A yearling can be an example of a new horse purchase.
- Property must be purchased and placed in service prior to 1/1/2014.
- Can be used in conjunction with the expense allowance described below.

Expense Allowance

- \$500,000 expense allowance is in place for 2013 and can be taken retroactively on purchases placed in service in 2012.
- Applies to new or used property; used is defined as having a prior use.
- Applies to horses, farm equipment and most other depreciable property.
- A broodmare is an example of a used horse.
- Property must be purchased and placed in service prior to 1/1/2014.
- Can be used to reduce taxable income derived from the horse business or any other business from which the taxpayer has income, including salaries.
- The \$500,000 expense allowance is reduced dollar for dollar once qualified investments exceed \$2 million.
- Can be used in conjunction with bonus depreciation.

Also, remember that accelerated depreciation for young racehorses continues through 2013. This means that taxpayers can depreciate racehorses that are 24 months and younger when purchased and placed in service using a 3-year schedule rather than the previous 7-year schedule. Taxpayers may use this accelerated schedule on any remaining balance that is not written off when taking bonus depreciation and/or the expense allowance.

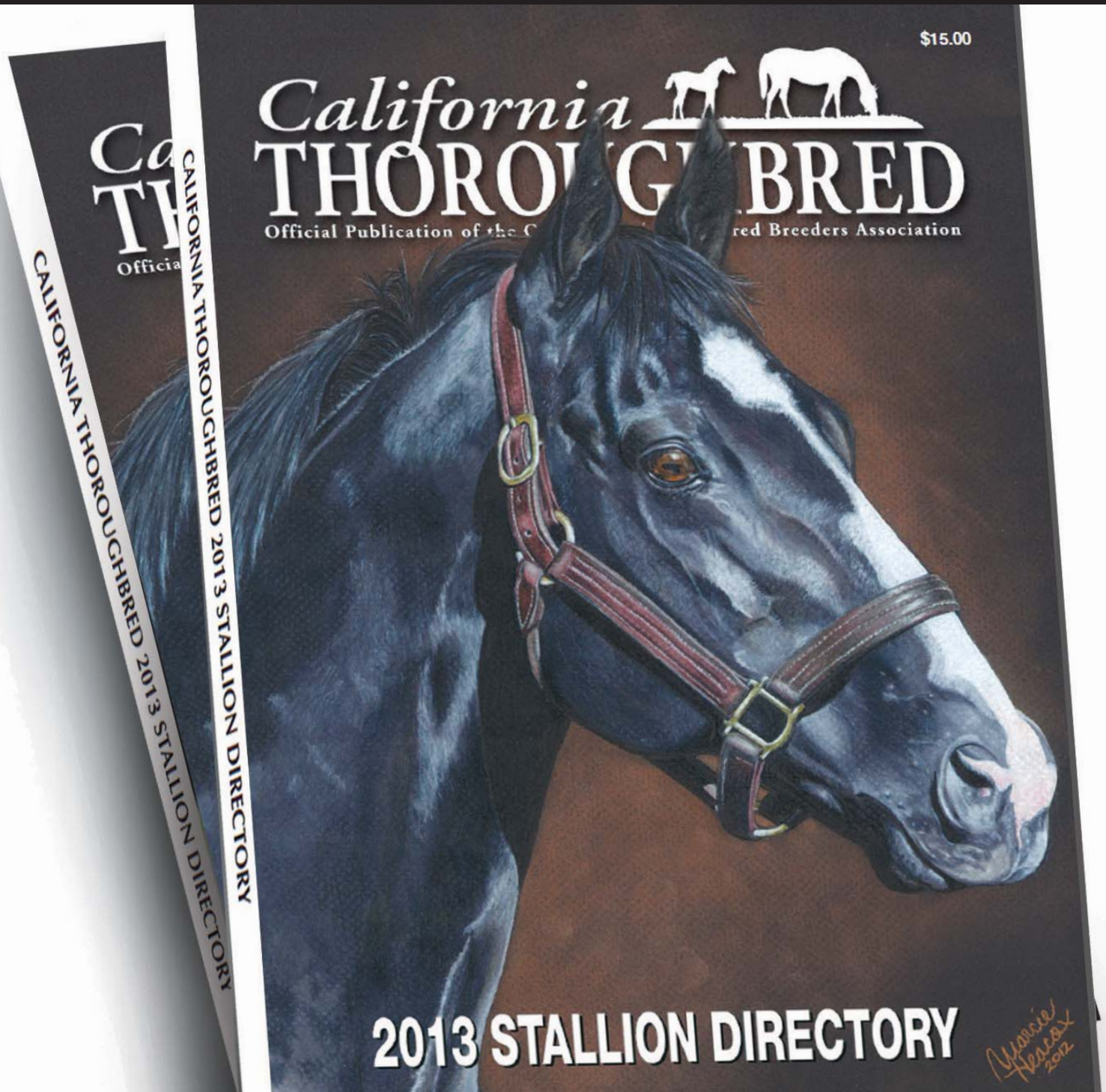

California-Bred Flashback Stylish Winner

On January 28, 1987, Stylish Winner, a son of Obraztsov, won the \$60,000 Santa Catalina Stakes for three-year-olds at Santa Anita Park, with Prince Sassafras second and Barb's Relic third in a field of seven. Stylish Winner was trained by Bruce Headley and ridden by Gary Stevens. He ran the 1 1/16 miles in 1:43 4/5 and won by 2 3/4 lengths at odds of 3-1. Stylish Winner was the fifth of nine foals out of the Fleet Discovery mare Lady With Style, who also produced stakes winner Stylish Stud and the unraced Winning in Style, broodmare of Eclipse Award winner Acclamation. The Santa Catalina was Stylish Winner's second win in six starts. He also won the grade III San Vicente Stakes, the On Trust Handicap and placed in 14 more stakes, including the grade I Californian Stakes. He finished his career with five wins in 54 starts and earnings of \$791,725. Stylish Winner was bred by and foaled at Old English Rancho in Ontario and was owned by Johnston, Headley and Roncelli et.al.
