Alameda County Fair in Pleasanton. There are 19 stakes scheduled at the six fair tracks—Pleasanton, Sacramento, Santa Rosa, Ferndale, Stockton, and Fresno—with the first one the \$50,000 California Wine Stakes at Pleasanton on June 23.

Each of the fairs except for Ferndale and Stockton offers at least one \$75,000 stakes. The bulk of the stakes money will be distributed at Pleasanton (\$375,000) and Santa Rosa (\$400,000), which will offer seven stakes each.

The 1 5/8-mile Humboldt County Marathon at Ferndale, where runners pass the finish line five times, has had its purse doubled from \$15,000 to \$30,000 and will be an open race instead of being restricted to lower-level claimers.

Two stakes were not brought back from last year, the Les Mademoiselle at Ferndale, which did not fill last year, and the \$75,000 Soviet Problem for two-year-old fillies at Fresno.

"There's a stakes for two-year-old fillies at Golden Gate a couple weeks later that will be run instead," fairs racing secretary Tom Doutrich said

Meet highlights include the \$75,000 Sam J. Whiting Memorial (July 4) for older sprinters at Pleasanton, the \$75,000 California State Fair Filly and Mare Sprint (July 21) at Sacramento, the \$75,000 Cavonnier Juvenile Stakes (August 12) and \$75,000 Wine Country Debutante (August 11) for two-year-olds and two-year-old fillies, respectively, at Santa Rosa; and the \$75,000 Charlie Palmer Futurity (October 6) for two-year-olds at a mile and \$75,000 Bulldog Handicap (October 14) for three-year-olds and up at 1 1/8 miles at the Big Fresno Fair.

Five of the seven stakes at Santa Rosa are scheduled for grass. Santa Rosa is the only fair track with a turf course.

"I think we have a balanced stakes schedule with sprints and routes for older runners and stakes on the turf," Doutrich said. <u>—continued at www.DRF.com</u>, By Steve Andersen

beginning his jumping career and was ridden by owner Haley Abbott.

"Benny," a 16-year-old offthe-track chestnut gelding, who now shows in eventing

and hunter/jumper, was ridden by Raeann Magill.

"Impala Supersport," a 21-year-old bay gelding who raced early on in life and went on to be an eventer and now a lesson horse, was ridden by Dana Todd.

"Kati," a 13-year-old off track bay mare who is now a handy polo horse, was also ridden by Raeann Magill.

Thoroughbreds are popular sport horses because of their adaptability to many events. The most common disciplines for Thoroughbreds are jumping, hunters, dressage and three-day-eventing, as well as polo because of their willingness to "never give up."

Western riders also use Thoroughbreds for barrel racing and working cows on large ranches as they are able to cover the hills smoothly and efficiently. Thoroughbreds are often used for gymkhana and large city mounted police forces. They are so versatile that they easily adapt to being cart horses, roping horses and trail horses.

Project To Identify At-Risk Horses Announced

The Jockey Club June 13 announced plans to develop a statistics-based system that would notify track officials and regulatory veterinarians when a horse who has been entered in a race is facing a heightened risk of injury.

Dr. Tim Parkin, a noted epidemiologist from the University of Glasgow who has conducted research and studies on Thoroughbreds in the United Kingdom and Hong Kong, is currently developing the protocols, which are based on The Jockey Club's Equine Injury Database. The project is expected to be complete in August 2012.

"This project provides us with an exciting opportunity to identify the top risk profiles and focus our interventions on the horses that fit those profiles," said Dr. Parkin, who made a presentation on the potential of such a system at The Jockey Club's Round Table Conference on Matters Pertaining to Racing in Saratoga Springs, New York, in August 2011.—continued at www.bloodhorse.com, By Blood-Horse Staff

Belmont Ratings Up With 7.67 Million Viewers

NBC's broadcast of the Belmont Stakes, which was won by Union Rags, drew 7.67 million viewers, a gain of 12 percent from last year's race (6.84 million on NBC), and up 62 percent from the 2010 race (4.74 million on ABC). Saturday's Belmont was the mostwatched in a non-Triple Crown year since 2005 on NBC, less than one percent lower than the 7.71 million that year, according to official national data provided Tuesday by The Nielsen Company.



The race portion of the Belmont (6:13-6:58 p.m. (EDT)) registered a 4.8/11 national household rating, 12 percent higher than

last year's 4.3/10 on NBC and 60 percent higher than the 2010 Belmont (3.0/7 on ABC).

The pre-race (5-6:13), bolstered by a 90-minute Belmont Access show on NBC Sports Network that preceded the NBC broadcast, drew 4.35 million viewers, up 27 percent from last year (3.43 million on NBC) and up 129 percent from the 2010 pre-race on ABC (1.90 million).—continued at www.bloodhorse.com, By Brisnet

Nutritional Considerations For Weanlings

Young horses are considered weanlings from the time they're separated from their mothers until one year of age. This is a critical time in the young horse's life, and nutrition plays an important part. Here are four important points to consider when feeding a weanling:

Nutritional Needs: From the time foals are weaned to the time they turn one, the young horse is considered to be on the highest nutritional plane of its life. Weanlings consume approximately three percent of their body weight in dry matter per day. Key components in the weanling's diet include:

Energy is needed to promote the growth and development of the young horse. Weanlings that consume too much energy will grow too fast, while too little energy will slow their growth. Both scenarios can put weanlings at risk for developmental orthopedic disorders. Consult a veterinarian or equine nutritionist to determine the ideal amount of energy for each weanling

High-quality protein is essential for muscle, ligament, and tissue development. Diets low in lysine will slow growth rate and decrease feed efficiency. The recommended amount of lysine in the diet of a young horse is five to six percent, so ensure weanlings' feed contains a quality source of lysine.

Treat Each Horse Individually: Regardless of breed or sex, each weanling should be individually monitored and fed according to their needs. Feeding each young horse on an individual basis will not only allow you to keep your feeding costs as low as possible, but also create the best nutritional plan for each animal.

Stress and Decreased Feed Intake: Weaning is an extremely stressful time for young horses. This stress is usually accompanied by a decrease in daily intake of food and slowed growth. —continued at www.theHorse.com, By Erica Larson, News Editor

Heart Rate Variability To Detect Equine Transport Stress

A fear of flying can lead to such extreme stress that many people find themselves unable to board an airplane. While horses aren't likely to show a true "fear of flying," they are undoubtedly stressed by air travel, according to a recently completed study of in-flight horses.

In addition to revealing stress levels of horses during air and road transport, the study led by Hajime Ohmura, DVM, PhD, of the Japan Racing Association's Equine Research Institute, also provided the researchers an opportunity to better evaluate the usefulness of heart rate variability (HRV) in analyzing equine stress.

Using an electrocardiogram, Ohmura et al. measured heart rate and heart rate variability of six healthy Warmblood horses during:

A 24-hour pre-transportation quarantine;

A 4 1/2-hour trailer ride;

A five-hour waiting period after the trailer ride; and

An 11-hour flight.

The team found that both air travel and road travel both caused major spikes in the heart rate of study horses compared to rest in quarantine. —<u>continued at www.theHorse.com</u>, By Christa Lesté-Lasserre

The inherit risks and costs associated with general anesthesia have led to an increase in the number of surgical procedures performed under standing sedation. Risks of general anesthesia include injury during recovery, cardiorespiratory collapse, and reduced blood flow, among others.


This type of surgery appears to offer advantages for the horse, the surgeon, and the owner, leading a pair of veterinarians from Rossdales Equine Hospital in Newmarket, England, to evaluate standing fracture repair outcomes.





On June 15, 2002, Hostility, a daughter of Devil His Due, won the \$55,000 Time to Leave Stakes at Bay Meadows Racecourse, with Solo Singer second and Proactive finishing third in a field of seven. Hostility was trained by Wesley Ward and ridden by Martin Pedroza. She ran the five furlongs in :58 seconds and won by a head at odds of 7-5. Hostility was the first of nine foals out of the Slewdledo mare Nifty Slew, who also produced stakes winner Don Juan Con and stakes-placed Any Questions. The Time to Leave was Hostility's second win in three starts. She also won the Thomas J. Malley Stakes and Hancock County Handicap and finished her career with 10 wins in 46 starts and earnings of \$401,829. As a broodmare, she has five foals, including stakes-placed King Samurai. Hostility was bred by Triple Crown Bloodstock and Good Guy Stables, was foaled at Running Luck Ranch in Parlier and was owned by Gerald Hannahs and Triple Crown Bloodstock.
