#### Golden State Series A Cal-Bred Windfall

Through the cooperation and shared support of the California racing industry, an additional \$2.325 million will be offered in restricted stakes purses in 2012 to two-year-old and three-year-old horses bred or sired in California.

The 2012 Golden State Series encompasses new stakes and purse enhancements to existing stakes that will be jointly funded by the Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC), the California Marketing Committee (CMC) and through nominations of two-year-olds in 2012.

"This is a wonderful addition to the Cal-bred racing program and a natural extension of the very successful maiden bonus program," said Doug Burge the Executive Vice President and General Manager of the California Thoroughbred Breeders Association (CTBA).

"Through the financial support once again of the entire racing industry in the state, we are able to provide a very lucrative return for those breeding and racing in California. While this program initially boosts the opportunities for two- and threeyear-olds and provides a quick reward to successful owners/breeders, it is our goal over time to expand the purses and number of races for older horses as well. We are especially thrilled to have Northern California participation in this new series. There are many reasons to breed and/or race in California, and the benefits continue to grow."

For foals of 2010, a \$300 eligibility payment must be made by February 15, 2012. Foals not made eligible by that date can become eligible with payment of a one-time supplemental fee of \$25,000. Foals of 2009 and earlier will be grandfathered into the program with no eligibility payment.

"With the current economic climate adversely affecting the breeding industry this is a major step in the right direction for California racing," said Martin Panza, the Racing Secretary and Vice President of Racing at Hollywood Park.

"We know that 50 percent of our field size is made up of California-breds and that this number is likely to increase, therefore any measures that we can take to ensure the future

#### Regular Noms For California Cup XXII Close Saturday, October 15

The five stakes races that will comprise the 22nd California Cup at Santa Anita Park on Saturday, October 29, attracted a total of 136 nominations, TALLEONNIA which are now online.

The stakes, topped by the \$175,000 California Cup Classic, presented by City National Bank, are NAAQ ATIN**Q** ATHA? part of a card restricted to California-breds that also includes two allowance races and two maiden races. Regular nominations are due on Saturday, October 15.

Among the 25 nominees to the Classic, which will be run at 1 1/8 miles on turf for the first time, are millionaire (and Breeders' Cup hopeful) Acclamation and fellow graded winner Caracortado, Lone Star Derby winner Thirtyfirststreet and last year's Cal Cup Classic Stakes winner, Soul Candy.

The \$125,000 John Deere Cal Cup Distaff, run at about 6 1/2 furlongs on the downhill turf course, has the most

nominations at 34, led by multiple graded stakes winner Unzip Me. Also on the list are multiple stakes winners California Nectar and Sugarinthemorning.

Caracortado also shows up on the list for the \$100,000 Donald Valpredo Cal Cup Sprint, as do Amazombie, 2010 Cal Cup Sprint winner Cost of Freedom, M One Rifle and former grade I winner Bob Black Jack, who is coming off a 20-month layoff.

The pair of races for two-year-olds—the \$100,000 Bob Benoit Cal Cup Juvenile for colts and geldings and the \$100,000 Robert H. Walter Cal Cup Juvenile Fillies—had a total of 47 noms. Among the 30 for the Juvenile is Ruler of Dubai. The Juvenile Fillies lists rivals Willa B Awesome and Heleonor Rugby.

The annual gala party for Cal Cup will be themed "The Art of Racing," and will be held in Santa Anita's Club Court and Club Plaza areas. Continued on next page





#### Acclamation Looks Ready For Breeders' Cup After Scoring In Clement Hirsch

Acclamation is bound for a Breeders' Cup race at Churchill Downs in Kentucky next month on the strength of an increas-

ingly impressive five-race winning streak, all in graded stakes.

The latest victory—in the grade I, \$150,000 Clement Hirsch Turf Championship Stakes over 1 1/4 miles on turf at Santa Anita Park on October 2—was truly a trial race. Ridden by Patrick Valenzuela, Acclamation (\$2.80) had an ideal trip, stalking pacesetter Make Music for Me to the final turn and holding off a sustained threat from Champ Pegasus to win by three-quarters of a length.

Acclamation was confidently ridden by Valenzuela, who gave his mount a few backhanded taps through the stretch to maintain an advantage. Acclamation ran 1 1/4 miles in turf in 1:59.45.

"It was a well-ridden race," trainer Don Warren said. "It's nice to see him lay second like that and go on to win. It's what we wanted five weeks to the Breeders' Cup."

#### **Tribal Rule Gets Japanese Winner**

Don Tribales, a California-bred two-year-old son of California stallion Tribal Rule (Ballena Vista Farm), won his debut at Hanshin Race Course in Kyoto, Japan, on October 2.

Don Tribales is out of the Prized mare Prized Possession and was bred by Charlotte Wrather. The \$47,000 Barretts purchase earned \$90,864 for the win and ran the 1200 meters in 1:11.70, winning by three-quarters of a length.

#### **Shadow Of Illinois Retired At 11**

Shadow of Illinois, who won the grade III San Simeon Handicap in 2005 and raced as an 11-year-old this year, has been retired, trainer Anthony Saavedra said.

A winner of 10 of 50 starts and \$517,295, the California-bred Shadow of Illinois is currently residing with Saavedra and his wife, Jennifer, at their home near Santa Anita.

"We're letting him down and getting him ready for the second phase of his life," Saavedra said Friday. "This will be better for him."

Aside from the San Simeon Handicap win, Shadow of Illinois was best known for the longevity of his racing career. He made one start at Sunland Park in 2003 and spent the rest of his career in Southern California, racing primarily in turf sprints.

Bred by Barbara Millard, Shadow of Illinois is by Illinois Storm and is out of the Trempolino mare My Annie T.

In recent months, Shadow of Illinois fought abscesses in his feet, Saavedra said. In the last few weeks, the Saavedras have considered training Shadow of Illinois to be a hunter-jumper.

"We might try that, and if it didn't work out, we'll find a green pasture for him," Saavedra said.

Even though he did not win a stakes after 2005, Shadow of Illinois remained competitive throughout the circuit. In 2009, he

won turf races at the five Southern California meetings that conduct turf racing—Santa Anita winter-spring, Hollywood Park spring-summer, Del Mar Thoroughbred Club summer, Oak Tree at Santa Anita, and the Hollywood Park fall.

Shadow of Illinois was winless in 10 starts in 2010 and 2011.

His last racetrack appearance was a sixth-place finish in an optional claimer for statebreds at Hollywood Park on July 8. Shadow of Illinois was entered for a \$25,000 claiming price that evening, a level he raced for frequently in the last 18 months.

"Racing at his level is pretty tough," Saavedra said. "I could find a spot someplace else, but he's been pretty good to us."

The abscesses that led to the Saavedras retiring Shadow of Illinois were not a new ailment. Shadow of Illinois wore glue-on shows throughout his career, Saavedra said. He credited farriers Ben Craft and Robert Treasure, exercise rider Daron Long, and veterinarian Vince Baker for caring for Shadow of Illinois, which allowed him to race to an advanced age.

"It was an unbelievable ride," Saavedra said. "The chances of coming up with another one like him in my career is pretty small. Even though he's at home, we miss him at the barn."

#### **Creative Cause Wins Norfolk**

Creative Cause, a Kentucky-bred out of the millionaire California-bred mare Dream of Summer, won the grade I, \$250,000 Norfolk Stakes for two-year-olds at Santa Anita Park on October 1.

The son of Giant's Causeway was bred by James Weigel, who raced the grade I winner Dream of Summer. Creative Cause has three wins in four starts and earnings of \$323,000. He is owned by Heinz Steinmann and trained by Mike Harrington.

## California Satellite Betting Bill Signed Into Law

Legislation designed to assist satellite wagering facilities in Callifornia has been signed into law by Gov. Jerry Brown.

The bill was sponsored by Democratic Assemblyman Henry Perea. "With declining attendance and fixed costs, some smaller satellite facilities have been forced to close because they couldn't afford to comply with the law," Perea said in a statement. "The passage of this law will help preserve the tradition of horse racing in California."

Under current law all satellite wagering facilities must have a supervisor on-site during operating hours. The requirement created "significant financial problems" for some of the smaller satellite facilities that can't afford to pay supervisor wages for several hours each day, according to a release from Perea's office.

The new law allows satellite facilities to waive the supervisor position requirement if it is determined the requirement creates a financial hardship.—<u>continued at www.bloodhorse.com</u>

#### **Breeder Robert Resnick Passes**

A memorial service was held Sunday for longtime California breeders Dr. Robert Resnick, who passed away September 23 after a 17-year battle with prostate cancer. He was 77.

Resnick was an undergraduate at UC Berkeley and earned a Ph.D in health administration at the University of Arizona.

A pharmacist by profession who served as director of pharmacy at Barlow Respiratory Hospital in Los Angeles, he began acquiring horses in the 1970s and in 1981 purchased 244 acres of grazing land in Santa Ynez he named Flying Horse Farm, where he bred to race. Among the stallions he stood there were It's the One, Adios (GB) and Arctic Action.

After his retirement, Resnick served on a number of nonprofit boards, including the Junior Guiders for the Foundation of the Junior Blind, Prostate Division for Cancer 911 and University Synagogue. He also served in the U.S. Army and Air Force Reserves.

He is survived by Carol, his wife of 50 years; sons Jeffrey and Jason, daughter-in-law Lisa Resnick and grandson Gavin.

Bonus depreciation is scheduled to drop to 50 percent next year.

#### Horse Slaughter Supporters, Opponents Face Off Online

Advocates on both sides of the horse processing issue have posted petitions on a U.S. government website that allows the public to inform the Obama administration about issues important to them.

The We The People website allows the public to create petitions on a range of issues including agriculture, the economy, and the environment. Petitions that receive 5,000 signatures within 30 days of their posting, will be reviewed by the White House staff before being submitted to the appropriate policy experts for an official response.

A September 22 petition posted on the site calls on the White House to restore humane horse slaughter on grounds that reestablishing horse processing in the U.S. will improve equine welfare and create jobs. Conversely, a petition posted on September 23, asks the Obama administration to support passage of the bills, on

grounds that banning horse processing in the U.S. would enhance equine welfare.

At press time on September 30, the pro-slaughter petition had received 1,327 of the 5,000 signatures needed by October 22 to warrant administration review and the anti-slaughter petition had posted 3,016 of the 5,000 signatures needed by October 23.

Wyoming lawmaker and horse processing supporter Sue Wallis said the petition provides those most affected by the demise of the US. horse processing in the U.S. a way to directly make their case to the White House.—continued at <a href="https://www.thehorse.com">www.thehorse.com</a>

On October 5, 1985, Justoneoftheboys, a son of Numa Pompilius, won the grade III, \$100,000 Volante Handicap for three-year-olds at Santa Anita Park, with Floating Reserve second and Schiller finishing third in a field of eight. Justoneoftheboys was trained by Ron McAnally and ridden by Alex Solis. He ran the 1 1/8 miles on turf in 1:47 3/5 and won by three-quarters of a length at odds of 12-1. Justoneoftheboys was the fourth of eight foals out of the Aegean Isle mare Chrissy Lou and was the first stakes winner for his sire and his dam. The Volante was Justoneoftheboys' fourth win in 12 starts. He also was third in the Oceanside Stakes, finishing his career with four wins in 19 starts and earnings of \$130,425. Justoneoftheboys was bred by John Roub, Eddie Truman, et al, was foaled at Lakeview Thoroughbred Farm in Lakeview and was owned by Cohen and Recachina.
