CHRB Chairman Headlines 13th Harris Ranch Seminar Friday, September 24 and Saturday, September 25

After a one-year hiatus, the annual Harris Ranch Seminar will enjoy his 13th renewal at the Harris Ranch Inn & Restaurant in Coalinga, California, on Friday, September 24 and Saturday, September 25, beginning at 10 a.m. on the first day and concluding at noon on the second day.

Co-sponsored by the California Thoroughbred Breeders Association (CTBA) and the Oak Tree Racing Association, the popular event was substituted the past year with a series of four videos that focused on the development of second careers for Thoroughbred racehorses once they were no longer active at the racetrack.

The keynote speaker at the Friday night dinner for this year's Harris Ranch Seminar, featuring an overall "Marketing the Thoroughbred" topic, will be the current Chairman of the California Horse Racing Board (CHRB), Keith Brackpool. The co-founder, President, Chairman and Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of Cadiz Inc., a publicly held renewable resources company based in Los Angeles, California, Brackpool has also served on several other state government boards and was appointed by Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger to the CHRB in September of 2009, while the board elected him it's Chairman at the beginning of this year. The devoted Thoroughbred racing enthusiast enjoyed success with the



group I-placed, multiple group winner Elbio (GB) in his native land during the early 1990s and he presently has horses in training locally with Carla Gaines.

As usual, the Harris Ranch Seminar will provide attendees with a host of other notable speakers.

Donal Ryan is the Managing Director of Equinome Ltd., with responsibility for the commercialisation and development of this biotech company based in Dublin, Ireland, since its establishment in 2009. Prior to joining Equinome, he worked for five years with industry-leading companies in the biotechnology industry in Ireland and Spain. He holds a B.E. (Chemical) from University College Dublin (UCD) and an M.B.A. from the UCD Michael Smurfit Graduate School of Business, one of Europe's premier business schools. His family have also been involved in the bloodstock industry in Ireland for a number of generations.

Also scheduled to visit the podium in 2010, are: Michael O'Hagan, the CEO of Irish Thoroughbred Marketing, an agency established in 1991 that is funded by sectors of the Irish bloodstock industry including the Irish Government through Horse Racing Ireland, the state body responsible for the horse racing industry in Ireland; Jeffrey Bloom, the Executive Vice President of West Coast Operations for West Point

Thoroughbreds, a horse racing partnership group which was founded nearly 20 years ago and now manages the equine portfolios of almost 400 individuals; and Barbara Marsh, a horse trainer whose Callison Farms operation at the Riverside Equestrian Center provides expertise in such areas as retraining ex-racehorses and rehabilitating “problem” horses.

The 2010 Harris Ranch Seminar will also include a couple of panels. Weekly Update

Noble Threewitt

Iconic Noble Threewitt, who trained horses for 75 years and was a venerated backstretch presence in California, has died at the age of 99, his grandson confirmed September 18.

Christopher Chinnici, in an email announcement, said the Southern California conditioner died September 16. Threewitt officially retired as an active trainer on his 96th birthday, February 24, 2007.

Threewitt, who arrived at his barn each morning at about 4 a.m. right up until he decided to retire, was well recognized in the industry for his contributions on the backstretch as well as for his success on the racetrack. The City of Arcadia declared his retirement to be “Noble Threewitt Day.”

A native of Benton, Illinois, Threewitt was believed to be the youngest trainer in the nation when he first took out his license at age 21 in 1931. He began his career at Agua Caliente Racetrack in Tijuana, Mexico, and went on to win more than 2,000 races.

Threewitt was on hand to witness the opening of Santa Anita Park in 1934 as well as Hollywood Park, Del Mar, Bay Meadows, and Golden Gate Fields in California and Longacres Racetrack and Emerald Downs in Washington. He won three successive training titles at Hollywood Park from 1959-61 and at Golden Gate Fields in 1970. His most impressive training feat was winning with nine consecutive starters at old Tanforan Racetrack near San Francisco in April 1956.

His best horse was Correlation, who won the 1954 Florida Derby and Wood Memorial Stakes. On April 22, 2006, 95-year-old Threewitt became the oldest trainer to win a race in North America when Threeatonce, a horse owned by Chinnici, won a maiden claiming race at Santa Anita.

Other stakes winners included King of Cricket,

Cuzwuzwrong, Debonaire Junior, Honeys Gem, Devoted Brass, Cerise Reine, Perizade, Speedy Edie, Mountain Glory, Try Sheep, Hula Blaze, Sea Eagle, Hairless Heiress, Old Topper and Theresa’s Tizzy.

A resident of Covina, Calif., he and his wife Beryl celebrated their 77th year of marriage in 2010. Beryl Threewitt died on July 12 at the age of 98.

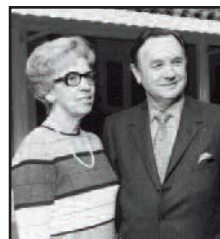
He served six terms as President of the California Horsemen’s Benevolent and Protective Association (HBPA), whose functions include the providing of free medical and dental benefits for stable workers and their families at a Santa Anita clinic. In 2004, Santa Anita Park renamed its backstretch medical facility the Noble Threewitt Health Center.

He served 16 years as national HBPA vice president and was President of the California Thoroughbred Horsemen’s Foundation (CTHF). Threewitt was also a director emeritus of California Thoroughbred Trainers (CTT).

Threewitt was close friends with legendary trainer Charlie Whittingham. In 2005, he won Hollywood Park’s Laffit Pincay Jr. Award for his extraordinary dedication to racing.

Late in his career, after his stable had dwindled, he told the *Los Angeles Times*: “The problem with living this long is that I’ve outlived all of the owners who kept me in good horses for so many years. I understand the alternative, but I had four or five owners who would each give me four or five of their top horses every year. I thought it was going to go on forever, but I finally ran out, and there’s nothing much you can do with a bad horse.”

A four-time graded winner in New York his 4-year-old season, **HIGH BRITE** raced in 41 stakes at 13 racetracks, winning 12 and placing in 14 other black type events. He retired with earnings of \$1,150,519.

HIGH BRITE's runners, like their sire, have been sound, productive and durable. Nineteen crops to race have produced 74% starters from foals, 80% winners from starters, 44 stakes winners, 43 stakes-placed and earners of \$33.8 million as of August 18, 2010.

In 1996 with five crops to race, **HIGH BRITE** was the national leader of winners (112) and races won (235). He led California's sire list again in 1997 with 115 winners, 251 races won and progeny earnings of \$3,072,626. His annual progeny earnings have surpassed \$2 million six times and \$1 million for 16 consecutive years, 1994-2009.

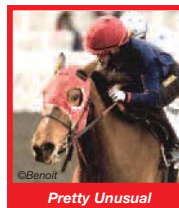
Faisca is by out of the High Yield mare High Warning, was bred by owners Mr. and Mrs. Walski and is trained by Caesar Dominguez.

Grade II Winner Pretty Unusual Dies

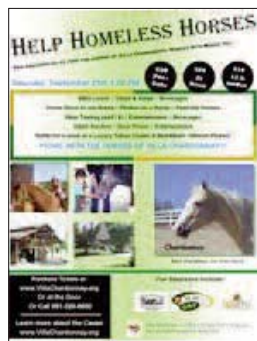
Grade II-winning California-bred Pretty Unusual died September 19 from complications following surgery, co-owner Madeline Auerbach and trainer Barry Abrams announced.

Mobile Tattoo Lookup Available

Tattooed but unknown Thoroughbreds can now be identified from the convenience of a smart phone following the integration of Tattoo Lookup into Registry mobile, the platform that enables owners and breeders to access The Jockey Club's Registry from their mobile device, it was announced Wednesday by Matt Iuliano, The Jockey Club's executive vice president and executive director.

Tattoo Lookup, a component of The Jockey Club's Tattoo Identification Services™, enables Interactive Registration (IR) customers to enter a tattoo number and receive the matching Thoroughbred's name, year of birth, color, sex and dam's name. Each successful lookup also includes a link to its mobile.equineline.com Five-Cross Pedigree.

We identified the need for a mobile capability when we saw the exceptional response to the desktop version," Iuliano said.

"Tattoo Lookup has been accessed more than 218,000 times since its launch in April 2009," said Andrew Chesser, customer service coordinator for The Jockey Club. "Ongoing dialogue with our customers and with representatives of retirement organizations leads us to believe that Tattoo Lookups will grow exponentially with the mobile service now available."

"The ability to look up tattoo numbers on a mobile device will be

extremely useful for rescue and retirement organizations and will surely aid in the identification of Thoroughbreds" said Erin Crady, executive director of Thoroughbred Charities of America.

According to Diana Pikulski, executive director of the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation, "This is the most useful innovation yet for the retirement/rescue community. More often than not, we are at auctions or in the 'field' trying to identify horses and make instant decisions and plans for the horse's welfare."

Registry mobile was launched in August providing access to the Online Names Book and the list of recently released names. To access Registry mobile, simply go to mobile.registry.jockeyclub.com or click on the link found at registry.jockeyclub.com.

The Jockey Club, founded in 1894 and dedicated to the improvement of Thoroughbred breeding and racing, is the breed registry for North American Thoroughbreds. CARMA Raises \$70,000

Retroactive Overnight Purse Boost at Del Mar

Del Mar Thoroughbred Club announced on September 21 that it will pay its horsemen a retroactive purse distribution estimated to be between \$850,000 and \$900,000.

The seaside California track said the retroactive purse payment covering the meet that ran from July 21 to September 8 will go toward overnight purses only, excluding the track's major stakes program. The distribution amounts to approximately 7.5 percent of the overnight purses paid in 2010, according to DMTC.

Once final figures from all sources have been confirmed, Del Mar officials expect to be sending out checks to horsemen by early November.



Del Mar's 71st summer meeting finished with a total handle of \$449,711,296 and a daily average of \$12,154,359.

"Our horsemen were, along with racing fans, the reason for a successful meet this summer," Del Mar's President and General Manager, Craig Fravel, said in a statement. "Our racing office managed the inventory well and, in the end the numbers both on the track and at the pari-mutuels were better than expected."

Del Mar's daily average purses for 2010—\$557,000 per day—are the highest in California and among the highest nationally.
